- Develop pupil understanding and appreciation of the responsibilities and rights of citizenship in a democracy.
- Further pupils' awareness of themselves and the possibilities of their own influence and contribution to society.
- Motivate pupils to further their education and develop their talents to better serve themselves and their families, communities and country.
- Give pupils a "real life" opportunity to develop skills individually and as a group, to get goals, develop action plans and strategies, make decisions and choices to accomplish goals.
- Enhance pupils' study of American History, and the U.S. Constitution.
