Rationale for Name Change	Gwendolyn Brooks possessed the outstanding character and high values desired for all students. Her contributions as the Illinois Poet Laureate and her life-long pursuit of learning make her a worthy role-model for the children of Chicago.
Brief Biography or Rationale Of Proposed School Name	Gwendolyn Brooks (1917-2000), American poet, the first African American to receive a Pulitzer Prize. Born in Topeka, Kansas, Brooks graduated from Wilson Junior College in Chicago, Illinois, in 1936. Her first book of poems, A Street in Bronzeville (1945), was praised by critics as a clear and moving evocation of life in an Urban black neighborhood. For the collection Annie Allen (1949), Brooks was awarded the 1950 Pulitzer Prize in poetry. Her other works include the Novel and Martha, Bronzeville Boys and Girls, The Bean Eaters, In the Mecca, Riot, Family Pictures, Aloneness, To Disembark, The Near-Johannesburg Boy, Blacks, Gottschalk and the Grande Tarantelle, and Children Coming Home. Brooks also published two autobiographical works, Report from Part One and Part Two.
