RATIFY AN AGREEMENT WITH THE CHICAGO EDUCATION ALLIANCE FOR CONSULTING SERVICES

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Ratify an agreement with the Chicago Educational Alliance (CEA) to provide consulting services to the Office of Curriculum and Instruction for the Department of Science, Mathematics Health and Technology at a cost not to exceed \$50,000.00. These services were obtained without prior Board approval. Consultant was selected on a non-competitive basis because CEA has an ongoing established working relationship with ten major university/college presidents and CEA was identified in the grant for the Chicago Urban Systemic Program (CUSP) grant (00-10-25-ED4) as the Board Liaison for CUSP and ten major University presidents. A written agreement for Consultant's services is currently being negotiated. No payment shall be made to Consultant prior to the execution of the written agreement. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written agreement is not executed within 60 days of the date of this Board Report. Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics – The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability - The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
