- WHEREAS, on January 27, 1992, he accepted a position of manager in the Department of Vocational Education, later rising to the position of assistant superintendent and then to deputy superintendent of the Department of Academic and Vocational Instructional Support; and
- **WHEREAS,** after a system-wide reorganization, Chief of Schools and Regions Dr. Blondean Y. Davis in 1996 named Adrian D. Beverly as one of her two Deputy Chiefs of Schools and Regions, and, as such, he supervised numerous and multifarious projects, programs, and initiatives; and
- **WHEREAS**, because of his experience and expertise, his duties and responsibilities were expanded to include the day-to-day operations of the schools; and
- **WHEREAS,** Adrian D. Beverly has always operated with one thought in mind: "Educate and help the children," and has, with dedication helped the children of the Chicago Public Schools.
