RATIFY EXERCISING THE FIRST OPTION TO EXTEND THE PRE-QUALIFICATION STATUS OF PROVIDERS OF FINE ARTS AND PERFORMING ARTS FOR CONSULTING SERVICES

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Ratify exercising the first option to extend the agreements with the attached list of fine arts and performing arts consultants to provide programs that will enhance cultural arts and fine arts curriculum to CPS students in grades K-12, at a cost for the option period not to exceed \$ 5,000,000.00 in the aggregate. Written extension agreements exercising this option are currently being negotiated. No payment shall be made to any Consultant during the option period prior to such consultant's execution of the written extension agreement. The pre-qualification status approved herein for each consultant shall automatically rescind in the event a written document is not executed within 90 days of the date of this Board Report. ORIGINAL AGREEMENTS: The original agreements (authorized by BR 00-0223-PR2) are for a term commencing with the effective date of each agreement, with all agreements ending June 30, 2001, with the Board having 3 options to renew the pre-qualified status of consultants for additional one-year periods, The original agreements were awarded pursuant to a duly advertised Request for Proposal (Spec# 99-250322).

OPTION PERIOD: The term of each agreement is being extended for 1 year commencing July 1, 2001 and ending June 30, 2002.

OPTION PERIODS REMAINING: There are 2 one-year options to extend remaining.

SERVICES/DELIVERABLES: Each consultant shall continue to provide the services and deliverables stated in their original agreements.

COMPENSATION: The sum of payments to all pre-qualified consultants for this option period shall not exceed \$5,000,000. All purchase orders per vendor, per school will be limited to no more than \$25,000.00.

USE OF POOL: Authorization to engage the consultants is limited to schools. Each school shall select a consultant and evidence such selection by a purchase order for services, which purchase order shall reflect the dollar amount for the services selected, and shall be approved by the school's REO, and then sent directly from each school to the selected consultant.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the written option documents. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the option documents.

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION: Each vendor agrees to comply with and be bound by the provisions of the Revised Remedial Plan for Minority and Women Business Enterprise Economic Participation (M/WBE Plan).

LSC REVIEW: Local School Council approval will be obtained whenever a school decides to use one of the pre-qualified consultants.

FINANCIAL: Various school budget costs to be determined by each individual school upon selection of program participation.

Fiscal Year: 2002

Source of Funds: Various

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Inspector General – Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Chicago Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Conflicts – The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board member during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics – The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability – The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
