# APPROVE THE PRE-QUALIFICATION STATUS OF SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICE PROVIDERS

### THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Approve the pre-qualification status of the attached list of educational and instructional consultants to provide supplemental educational services to eligible NCLB schools at an aggregate cost not to exceed \$10,000,000.00. Consultants were selected pursuant to that certain *Approved List of Supplemental Educational Service Providers* established by the Illinois State Board of Education as required by provisions of the federal *No Child Left Behind Act*. Written master agreements for all consultants are currently being negotiated. No payment shall be made to any consultant prior to the execution of such consultant's written master agreement. The pre-qualification status approved herein for each consultant shall automatically rescind in the event such consultant fails to execute the Board's master agreement within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. Information pertinent to this master agreement is stated below.

**CONSULTANTS:** See attached list of 11 ISBE approved Supplemental Services providers who have agreed to provide services to the Chicago Public Schools for FY2003. NOTE: Chicago Public Schools is also an ISBE approved provider.

**TERM:** The term of this pre-qualification period and each agreement shall commence on March 27, 2003 and shall end June 30, 2003. The pre-qualification period and each agreement may be extended for three (3) additional one (1) year period(s).

**EARLY TERMINATION RIGHT:** The Board may terminate any of these agreements for any or no reason upon thirty days written notice to consultants.

**SCOPE OF SERVICES:** Consultants will provide various supplemental educational and instructional services in mathematics, reading and English language arts based on the scope of services developed and approved by the Illinois State Board of Education and as indicated on the attached list. Consultants will provide tutoring and other high-quality academic enrichment services during non-school hours.

**DELIVERABLES:** Deliverables will vary according to each consultant's proposal. The Office of Accountability will monitor receipt of the deliverables. Examples of deliverables that are common to all of the consultants are:

- A supplemental support program in reading and/or mathematics selected by parents
- Individualized or small group instruction through tutoring and other high quality academic

enrichment services and instruction materials

Assessment and feedback to parents regarding progress of their children

**OUTCOMES:** Consultant's services will result in improved overall academic performance and increased achievement on standardized tests, improved student confidence and positive attitude through self-paced progress and achievement, and an increased level of parental involvement in their child's education.

**COMPENSATION:** Consultants will be compensated on a cost per hour per student basis as identified in their respective agreements and based on invoices with support documentation from students' parents/guardians.

**USE OF THE POOL**: Parents of students who are eligible through the *No Child Left Behind Act* shall have the right to select any one of the consultants or the Chicago Public Schools to provide supplemental services to their child and notify the Office of Accountability of such selection. In the event parental requests for services exceed available resources, parent selections will be prioritized in accordance with NCLB guidelines. Students to be served shall include students in the general population, students currently receiving specialized services, and English language learners who need additional support in order to be successful. The Office of Accountability shall then formally engage the consultants via issuance of a purchase order to the consultant detailing the students served, type of services needed and the dollar amount for such services. All services will be rendered in accordance with the guidelines that the United States Department of Education and the Illinois State Board of Education have established.

**AUTHORIZATION:** Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the written master agreements. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the master agreements. Authorize the Chief Accountability Officer to execute all ancillary documents required to administer or effectuate these agreements.

**AFFIRMATIVE ACTION**: These contracts are exempt from review under the Board's Revised Remedial Plan for Minority and Women Business Enterprise Economic Participation (M/WBE Plan), as this is a tuition-based program.

LSC REVIEW: Local School Council approval is not applicable to this report.

**FINANCIAL:** Various school budget costs to be determined by each individual school upon selection of program participation.

# **GENERAL CONDITIONS REGARDING PRE-QUALIFIED PROGRAMS**

All pre-qualified vendors shall be required to enter into the Board's standard master agreement, which master agreement shall specifically identify the services to be provided by each vendor and

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shall include other basic contractual terms and conditions as deemed appropriate by the General Counsel.

The Chief Accountability Officer shall develop, within six (6) months of the establishment of the prequalified program, a qualitative evaluation process which will rate each vendor's performance under the program and allow for a vendor's continued pre-qualification status, or to provide grounds for revoking a vendor's pre-qualification status.

The Chief Purchasing Officer shall monitor all purchase orders, or such other documents as required, to ensure that the program remains within its budgetary limitations.

The Office of Accountability may only utilize a pre-qualified vendor for those services for which such vendor has been pre-qualified and are identified in such vendor's master agreement.

Pursuant to Board Rule 5-10.2, the Chief Purchasing Officer shall submit a quarterly Board Report which reports expenditures made during the previous quarter to pre-qualified vendors including accounting and reconciliation of such expenditures to individual vendors against the total expenditure authorized for the applicable pre-qualified pool of vendors.

# **GENERAL CONDITIONS:**

Inspector General – Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Conflicts – The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board members during the one-year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics – The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability – The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
