AMEND BOARD REPORT 01-1219-PR16 APPROVE THE RENEWAL OF THE AGREEMENT WITH BONAPARTE CORPORATION FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS FIELD MOVES, ADDS AND CHANGES SERVICES

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Approve the renewal of the agreement with Bonaparte Corporation to provide field moves, adds and changes services for the Office of Technology Services at a cost not to exceed \$4,512,008.40 \$4,712,008.40 during the renewal term. Vendor was selected pursuant to a request for cost proposals solicited in accordance with the guidelines and requirements issues by the Federal Government's Universal Services Program. Because vendor currently has a contract for these services, a new contract is not necessary and the parties have agreed to renew the current contract. A written renewal agreement is currently being negotiated. No payment shall be made to the vendor prior to the execution of the written renewal agreement. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written document is not executed with ninety (90) days of the date of this Board Report. Information pertinent to this renewal is stated below:

This amendment is necessary to increase the dollar amount of the contract by \$200,000.00 for additional resources required to implement Phases 2 and 3 of CPS' Enhanced E911 Project. These additional resources are not E-Rate Eligible. A written amendment to the existing agreement is currently being negotiated. No payment shall be made to Bonaparte for these additional resources prior to the execution of the written amendment. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment is not executed within ninety (90) days of the date of this Board Report.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original agreement (authorized by Board Report 01-0627-PR17) is for a term commencing July 1, 2001 and ending December 31, 2001 in an amount not to exceed \$1,320,517.54. Vendor was selected on a non-competitive basis because Bonaparte has extensive knowledge and experience within the Chicago Public Schools performing this function as a subcontractor.

RENEWAL PERIOD: By mutual consent of the parties, the agreement is being renewed for a period commencing January 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2003. This 18-month renewal term is necessary to coincide with and allow for the Board's participation in Year 5 of the E-Rate Program.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: Bonaparte Corporation will continue to provide the following: Nineteen (19) union field technicians and one (1) working Union supervisor qualified in the various aspects of the telecommunications MAC function of station wiring, and riser cable telephone set installation, system programming of the Lucent and Merlin equipment, voice messaging programming, extending and testing Local Exchange Carrier (LEC) services and other repair services in support of the voice/data telecommunications function. In addition, Bonaparte Corporation will provide eight (8) union field

technicians to inventory schools as scheduled by the E911 Project Team and reprogram telephone systems as required. Phase 2 consists of data collection from 45 schools, resource allocation, database requirements determination and a full pilot of three schools including telephone system programming. Phase 3 consists of data collection of additional schools as well as system reprogramming implementation.

DELIVERABLES: Bonaparte Corporation will continue to provide nineteen (19) union field technicians and one (1) working Union supervisor to support the MAC function. <u>In addition, Bonaparte will provide eight (8) union field technicians to work exclusively on the E911 project.</u>

OUTCOMES: The Board will continue to have field technician services for MAC for the period beginning on January 1, 2002 and ending on June 30, 2003.

COMPENSATION: Vendor shall be paid as follows: Upon monthly invoicing, not to exceed \$4,512,008.40 \$4,712,008.40. These services are eligible for, but not contingent upon, E-Rate discounts under the Federal Government's Universal Services Program. The additional \$200,000.00 is not eligible for E-Rate discounts.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the written renewal agreement. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the renewal agreement. Authorize the Chief Technology Officer to execute all ancillary documents required to administer or effectuate this renewal agreement.

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION: The M/WBE goals for this contract include: 35% total MBE, 22% total African American, 10% total Hispanic, 2% total Asian and 5% total WBE.

However, the Waiver Review Committee recommends that a partial waiver of the M/WBE participation goals for this contract as required by the Revised Remedial Plan be granted because the contract scope is not further divisible.
