APPROVE HEARING OFFICER'S FINDING THAT PUPIL WAS A RESIDENT OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO ENTITLED TO ATTEND THE CHICAGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS ON A TUITION-FREE BASIS

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING:

That the Chicago Board of Education adopt the November 20, 2003, findings of fact of the Board-appointed Hearing Officer from a Pupil Residency Hearing held October 30, 2003, that (i) the pupil (ID No. 42159778) was a resident of the City of Chicago entitled to attend the Chicago Public Schools on a tuition-free basis during the 2002-2003 school year; and (ii) that the parents of the pupil are not indebted to the Board for non-resident student tuition for the pupil s attendance in the Chicago Public Schools for the 2002-2003 school year.

DESCRIPTION:

Sections 10-20.12a and 10-20.12b (105 ILCS 5/10-20.12a and 10-20.12b) of the Illinois School Code and Board Rule 5-17 authorize and empower the Board to charge tuition, not exceeding 110% of the per capita cost of maintaining its schools during the preceding school year, to pupils enrolled in the Chicago Public Schools determined to be non-residents of the City of Chicago. Further, section 10-20.12b provides that a hearing be held, when requested by the person who enrolled the pupil, to determine whether or not a pupil who is believed to be a non-resident resides within School District 299. If, after notice of the initial determination of non-residency, the person who enrolled the pupil does not request a hearing or, if requested, the hearing results in a finding that the pupil does not reside in the district, the person who enrolled the pupil shall be charged tuition for the period of non-resident school attendance and the pupil shall be barred from attending school in the district unless the required tuition is paid for the pupil.

FINANCIAL: If the pupil is found to have been a non-resident during any time the pupil

attended the Chicago Public Schools, the person(s) who enrolled the pupil

shall be charged tuition for that time.

In accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Chicago Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and the Inspector General shall have access to all information

and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.
