## RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (FISCAL YEAR 2005) FOR THE CHICAGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS

- WHEREAS, there are numerous schools and related facilities in the Chicago Public Schools system which are in a state of disrepair or are obsolete; and
- WHEREAS, there is overcrowding at certain attendance centers in the system and additional attendance centers, classrooms and school additions need to be constructed; and
- **WHEREAS**, schools and related facilities that are obsolete, in a state of disrepair or overcrowded interfere with the educational process; and
- WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the students, parents and employees of the system to undertake a program of capital improvements to renovate existing school buildings and related facilities, to build additional facilities, and to reduce overcrowding; and
- WHEREAS, the Board approved the first year of the Capital Improvement Program on January 24, 1996; and
- WHEREAS, the Board approved Phase II of the Capital Improvement Program on February 26, 1997; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Board approved the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Years 1999-2003) on May 27, 1998; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Board approved the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Years 2000-2004) on June 23, 1999; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Board approved the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Years 2001-2005) on June 28, 2000; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Board approved the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Years 2002-2006) on July 25, 2001; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Board approved the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Years 2003-2007) on June 26, 2002; and
- WHEREAS, the Board approved the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Year 2004) on June 25, 2003; and
- WHEREAS, the Board has conducted six public hearings and received input from numerous parties; and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interest of the students, parents and employees in the system that the Board adopt and approve the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Year 2005), and proceed presently with the program.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CHICAGO BOARD OF EDUCATION AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Board adopts and approves the Capital Improvement Program (Fiscal Year 2005) (exhibits attached).
- 2. The Board directs its officers, agents, and employees responsible for implementation to proceed with the Capital Improvement Program forthwith. Except as authorized by Board Rule or other Board actions, the capital improvements comprising the Capital Improvement Program approved by the Board on the date hereof (the "Program") shall not be amended or revised, and no additional capital improvements shall be added to the Program, and no capital improvements shall be deleted from the Program.
- 3. This Resolution shall be in full force and effective immediately upon its adoption.
