- **WHEREAS**, Dr. Dyson remained principal and instructional leader of the school as it evolved into, and was reopened as, Martin Luther King Jr. College Preparatory Academy High School; and
- **WHEREAS**, in 2002 Dr. Pamela Dyson became principal of Gwendolyn Brooks College Preparatory Academy; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Pamela Dyson was instrumental in expanding learning opportunities for her students, providing access to such activities as honors programs, computer classes, after school programs, and creative writing courses; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Pamela Dyson will be remembered as an educator, leader, mentor and pioneer; and
- **WHEREAS,** Dr. Pamela Dyson's commitment and tireless efforts on behalf of countless Chicago public school students has been invaluable.
