PROGRAM: As a culminating experience after a year-long colloquium class spent learning the historical, political, and cultural significance of Scotland, students will travel throughout the entire country. Students will visit Edinburgh, Fife, Pitlochry, the Highlands, Fort William, The Isle of Skye, Loch Lomond, and Glasgow. Highlights include guided sightseeing tours of Edinburgh, visits to Stirling and Blair Castles, a visit to Loch Ness, traveling to the "Road of Isles" and the Trossachs National Park. Additionally students will participate in a tradition Scottish ceilidh evening.

EDUCATIONAL VALUE/OUTCOMES: The purpose of this travel is to broaden students' horizons and make connections between classroom curriculum and the real world via first hand experiences with different cultures. Student travel locations will focus on their classroom investigations of Medieval and Modern Scotland. For example, after having studied the historical significance of Mary Queen of Scots, students will visit her childhood castle.
