AMEND BOARD REPORT 05-0323-EX11 APPROVE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ROBERT LINDBLOM MATH & SCIENCE ACADEMY HIGH SCHOOL

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS:

That the Chicago Board of Education approve the establishment of the Robert Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School as a Selective Enrollment High School.

This amendment is necessary to update the School Profile to reflect the establishment of a Biotechnology/Science Teacher Training Academy at Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School.

DESCRIPTION

The Chicago Public Schools will open and operate the Robert Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School beginning in school year 2005-2006.

School Designation: The Board hereby designates Robert Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School as an alternative school pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/34-2.4b.

Public Hearing

Pursuant to the terms of the Modified Desegregation Consent Decree, a public hearing was not required prior to the opening of the Robert Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School.

Facilities and Campus

The Robert Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School ("Academy") will share the facilities and campus located at 6130 South Wolcott Avenue, Chicago, Illinois 60636, with the Robert Lindblom College Preparatory High School (Unit No. 6790) for the 2005-2006 school year.

Enrollment

The Academy will enroll students citywide through the selective enrollment application process. The Academy will enroll approximately 150 to 200 freshmen every year beginning in the 2005-2006 school year and will add sophomore, junior and senior classes annually as the students progress. Beginning in the 2008-2009 school year, the school will function as a four-year institution with grades 9 through 12.

School Profile and Curriculum

The new Robert Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School will offer a 4-year progressive curriculum in honors and advanced placement classes in English, Mathematics, Science Social Studies, Foreign Language and the Arts. The school's focus will be upon educational opportunities beyond high school via an accelerated, rigorous curriculum focusing on mathematics and science. Accelerated classes and enrollment will offer students opportunities to develop and refine their potential talent and skills. Global strategies and collaborations with students, teachers, and college personnel, a long with internship opportunities will enable students to develop critical thinking skills and knowledge for educational advancement. The criteria for teacher selection at the Academy shall reflect the structure and content of the school's curriculum.

In September 2008, Lindblom Math & Science Academy High School will establish a Biotechnology/Science Teacher Training Academy in partnership with Baxter Laboratories to provide lesson plans, curriculum, instructional delivery strategies and related training to high school science teachers throughout the District. The purpose of the Training Academy is to establish consistent science programming in CPS High Schools, and to increase the number of CPS science teachers that provide expanded high school science instruction options for students. In establishing the Training Academy at Lindblom, the District seeks to improve high school science instruction through expanded science program offerings.

Governance

A Local School Council with voting boundaries will be established in a manner pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/34-2.1c (2004). An Appointed Local School Council will be established in a timely manner pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/34 2.4b.
