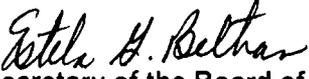

APPROVE FORMER TENURED TEACHER SUSAN BALEY'S BACK PAY

THE GENERAL COUNSEL REPORTS THE FOLLOWING:

DESCRIPTION: Dismissal charges were filed against Susan Baley in 2008 for allegedly refusing to allow a special education student to enter Tilden Career Community Academy because she was not in uniform. The student allegedly became lost and ended up sleeping in a park. Pending the dismissal hearing, Baley was suspended without pay on November 21, 2008.

After a dismissal hearing, Hearing Officer Dennis Stoia issued a decision on August 31, 2009, recommending the reinstatement of tenured teacher Susan Baley and ordering the Board of Education of the City of Chicago to make her whole for all lost wages and benefits. While the Board accepted hearing officer Stoia's recommendation to reinstate Baley, it issued Baley a 30-day suspension and Warning Resolution on October 28, 2009, due to her gross negligence and insubordinate actions.

In lieu of returning to the teaching ranks, Baley resigned from the Board effective November 17, 2009. Nonetheless, the Board owes Baley back pay, less mitigation, for the time period of November 21, 2008 through November 17, 2009.

Additionally, Baley challenged the 30-day suspension and Warning Resolution that the Board issued to her in the Circuit Court of Cook County. After briefing and arguing the case, on October 6, 2010, Judge Rita Novak ordered that the suspension and Warning Resolution be rescinded. This is a final order.

After taking into consideration amounts received in mitigation of her losses, the final back pay owed to Baley is as follows:

- a) Back pay amount of \$67,662.95, less legally required deductions; and
- b) Pension contribution of approximately \$4,736.41.

Total Amount: \$67,662.95 plus a pension contribution of approximately \$4,736.41.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Bond Resolution, the Board has levied a direct annual tax for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, and has directed the County Clerks of The Counties of Cook and DuPage, Illinois (the "County Clerks") to extend such taxes in amounts sufficient to pay such debt service as the same becomes due (the "Pledged Taxes") pursuant thereto, and

WHEREAS, Section 504(A)(iii) of the Indenture provides that promptly after sufficient Pledged Revenues (as defined in the Indenture) have been deposited in the Deposit Sub-Account (as defined in the Indenture) in any calendar year in an amount sufficient to pay the interest on and the principal of the Series 1997A Bonds due during the Bond Year, the Trustee shall notify the Board of that fact and the Board shall take such actions as are necessary to abate the Pledged Taxes levied and to be extended for the then-current calendar year in full; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received the notice described in the preceding paragraph from the Trustee evidencing the sufficiency of the Pledged Revenues deposited into the Deposit Sub-Account to pay the interest on and the principal of the Series 1997A Bonds due during the Bond Year beginning December 2, 2010, and the Board hereby finds that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Board that the Pledged Taxes heretofore levied and to be extended for the year 2010 to pay such debt service on the Series 1997A Bonds be abated in full.

WHEREAS, the Resolution 98-0826-RS8, in Section 7(e) provides that upon a determination made by the Board during the calendar year prior to any Principal Payment Date that the Intergovernmental Agreement Revenues will be available in a timely manner to pay the principal of the bonds coming due on such Principal Payment Date, the board shall direct the abatement of the Pledged Taxes levied for such year. The Board shall direct such abatement of the Pledged taxes and proper notification of any such abatement shall be filed with (i) the County Clerks, in a timely manner to effect such abatement; and (ii) the County Collectors, so as to advise such officers of the amount of the Pledged taxes, if any, to be extended for collection

Section 2. Levy. There are levied for the Board's 2010-2011 Fiscal Year, upon all taxable property in the City of Chicago, school taxes for the purpose of establishing and supporting free schools and defraying their expenses, for the following specific purposes:

(a) For educational purposes, including without limitation, in addition to general education purposes, including, as authorized before the adoption of Public Act 89-15, constructing, acquiring, leasing (other than from the Public Building Commission of Chicago), operating, maintaining, improving, repairing, and renovating land, buildings, furnishings, and equipment for school houses and buildings, and related incidental expenses; provision of special education; furnishing free textbooks and instructional aids and school supplies; establishing, equipping, maintaining, and operating supervised playgrounds under the control of the Board, school extracurricular activities, and stadia, social centers and summer swimming pool programs open to the public in connection with any public school; making an employer contribution to the Public School Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund as required by Section 17-129 of the Illinois Pension Code, 40 ILCS 5/17-129; providing an agricultural science school, including site development and improvements, maintenance, repairs, and supplies; and student transportation expenses \$2,030,500,000

(b) For the purpose of paying tort judgments and settlements, paying costs of insurance, individual or joint self-insurance (including reserves thereon), including all operating and administrative costs and expenses directly associated therewith, claims services and risk management directly attributable to loss prevention and loss reduction, legal services directly attributable to the insurance, self-insurance or joint self-insurance program, and educational, inspectional and supervisory services directly relating to loss prevention and loss reduction; discharging obligations under Section 34-18.1 of the School Code, 105 ILCS 5/34-18.1; paying the cost of risk management programs; establishing reserves for executed losses for any liability or loss as provided in 745 ILCS 10/9-107; and protection against and reduction of liability or loss as described above under Federal or State statutory or common law, the Workers' Compensation Act, Workers' Occupational Disease Act, and the Unemployment Insurance Act \$ 55,000,000

Any reductions in extensions required by the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law shall be as directed by the Board as provided in the Controller's Certificate, including as it may be amended from time to time, as provided in Section 34-54.1 of the School Code, 105 ILCS 5/34-54.1, to be filed with the County Clerks of the Counties of Cook and DuPage.

All taxes levied by this Resolution are in addition to any taxes levied for any previous fiscal year or for any lease rentals for the Public Building Commission of Chicago or any Bonds of the Board.

Section 3. Certificate. It is certified that the Board requires the taxes to be levied as provided in Section 2 of this Resolution upon all taxable property in the City of Chicago. The President and the Secretary of the Board are authorized and directed to certify to the County Clerks of the Counties of Cook and DuPage the total amount of the levy of such taxes for the Board for the Fiscal Year 2010-2011, as required by law, as set forth in this Resolution.

Section 4. Effectiveness. This Resolution is effective and in full force immediately upon its adoption.

Whereas, it is necessary that the Controller of the Board be authorized and directed to file with the County Clerks a Controller's Certificate pertaining to school taxes to be extended for collection in calendar year 2011, such taxes to consist of (i) a portion of the school taxes levied by the 2007-2008 School Tax Levy Resolution for the Board's 2007-2008 Fiscal Year, (ii) a portion of the school taxes levied by the 2008-2009 School Tax Levy Resolution for the Board's 2008-2009 Fiscal Year, (iii) school taxes previously levied for the purpose of providing revenue for the payment of rent provided for in various leases entered into between the Board and the Public Building Commission of Chicago, and (iv) school taxes previously levied for the purpose of paying principal and interest on Unlimited Tax General Obligation Bonds (Dedicated Revenues) Series 1996, 1997, 1997A, 1999A, 1999C, 2000A, 2000B, 2000C, 2000D, 2001A, 2001C, 2002A, 2003A, 2003B, 2003D, 2004A, 2004B, 2004C, 2004D, 2004E, 2004F, 2004G, 2004H, 2005A, 2005B, 2005C, 2005D, 2005E, 2006A, 2006B, 2007A, 2007B, 2007C, 2007D, 2008A, 2008B, 2009A, 2009B, 2009C, 2009D, 2009EF, 2009G, 2010A, 2010B, 2010C, 2010D, 2010EF, 2010G.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

Section 1. Filing of Controller's Certificate. You are directed to extend for collection in calendar year 2011, upon the value of all taxable property within the City of Chicago (the "City"), the boundaries of which are coterminous with the boundaries of the school district governed by the Board, as equalized or assessed by the Illinois Department of Revenue for calendar year 2010, the following taxes.

2. The aggregate amount of school taxes which are to be extended for collection in calendar year 2011, as set forth in Section 1 of this Certificate, are as follows (but such amounts shall always be subject to the limiting provisions set forth below):

For Educational Purposes as described in Section 1 of this Certificate	\$ 2,171,240,225
For Liability Protection Purposes as described in Section 1 of this Certificate	\$ 55,000,000

Provided, however, the total amount of the levy for Educational Purposes for the Board's Fiscal Year 2010-2011, which you shall extend for collection in calendar year 2011, shall be limited to an amount, such that the amount to be extended for collection for Educational Purposes as set forth in Section 1 of this Certificate does not exceed the sum of (a) 3.07%, and (b) the difference between .50% and the rate for taxes extended by the Chicago School Finance Authority for calendar year 2011, measured by the value of taxable property as equalized or assessed for calendar year 2010, as determined by you and certified to the Board, pursuant to and in accordance with the proviso set forth in Section 18-110 of the Property Tax Code, 35 ILCS 200/18-110, of the value of all taxable property within the City, as equalized and assessed by the Illinois Department of Revenue for calendar year 2010. 5. Any reduction in extensions required by the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law shall be taken solely from the extension for Educational Purposes, except as subsequently directed by the Controller.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF CHICAGO TO OPEN, CONSTRUCT, EXTEND AND
WIDEN PUBLIC STREETS ADJACENT TO THE NEW SOUTHWEST AREA HIGH SCHOOL
AS PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the City of Chicago (the "Board") acquired title to 37 acres of vacant property bounded by the Belt Railroad Right of Way on the north, Kedzie Avenue on the east, 77th Street on the south, and Homan Avenue on the west ("Property") for the construction of a new Southwest Area High School ("High School"); and

WHEREAS, title to the Property was acquired in the name of the City of Chicago in Trust for Use of Schools; and

WHEREAS, the Board has engaged the Public Building Commission (the "PBC") to construct a new Southwest Area High School on the west half of the Property at the northeast corner of Homan Avenue and 77th Street; and

WHEREAS, Spaulding Avenue between 75th Street on the north and 77th Street on the south and 75th Street between Spaulding Avenue as extended on the east and Homan Avenue on the west do not currently exist and, Homan Avenue between the north line of 76th Place and 75th Street is less than 66 feet wide; and

WHEREAS, to provide access to and from the new High School and for the installation and maintenance of the utilities to service the High School, the Board has determined that it is in its best interest to open and extend the following streets on the Property as public rights of way: (1.) Spaulding Avenue, as a 66 foot wide public right of way from 75th to 77th Streets; (2.) 75th Street, as a 50 foot public right of way from Homan Avenue to Spaulding Avenue; and (3.) to widen Homan Avenue by opening the west 33 feet of the Property from the north line of 76th Place to the north line of 75th Street as extended, all as shown on the Plat of Opening attached hereto as Exhibit A and as legally described on Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chicago has agreed to construct and will become responsible for the maintenance and repair of Spaulding Avenue as extended, 75th Street as extended, and Homan Avenue as widened when these parcels of property become public roads and public rights of way.

NOW, THEREFORE the Board of Education of the City of Chicago hereby declares and states:

(1.) The Recitals as stated above are referenced and incorporated herein.

(2.) The City of Chicago, on behalf of the Board, is authorized to open, construct, extend and widen as public rights of way, Spaulding Avenue from 75th Street to 77th Street as a 66 foot public right of way; 75th Street between Spaulding Avenue and Homan Avenue as a 50 foot wide public right of way, and the west 33 feet of the Property between the north line of 76th Place and the north line of 75th Street for the widening of Homan Avenue, all as shown on the Plat of Opening attached hereto as Exhibit A and legally described on Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein

(3.) The President and Secretary of the Board are authorized to execute on behalf of the Board, the documentation required to open, construct and extend Spaulding Avenue and 75th Street as public rights of way and to widen Homan Avenue as described above and to transfer jurisdiction, control and responsibility for the property described on Exhibits A and B to the City of Chicago upon the recording of the Plat of Opening.

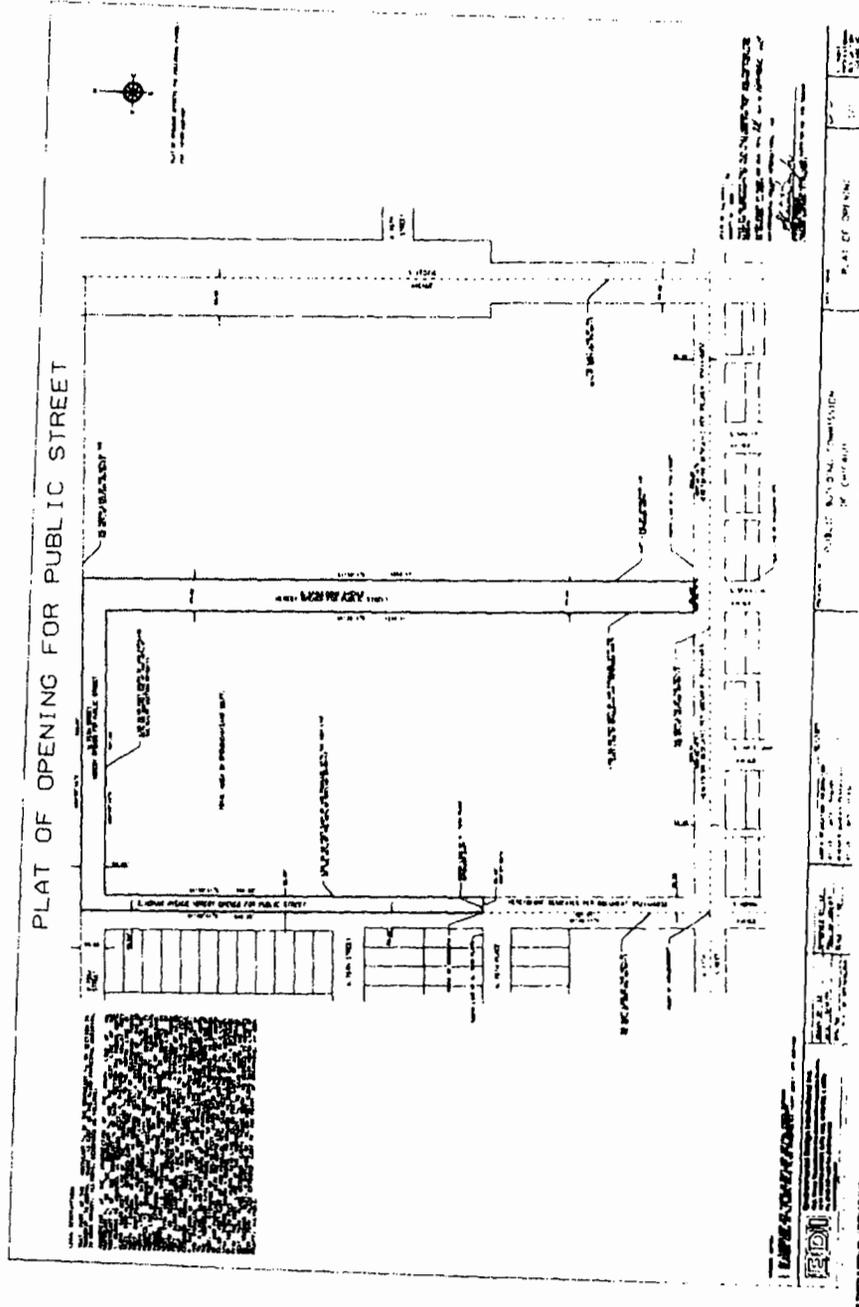

**RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF COVERAGE FOR THE
CHICAGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS' INTERSCHOLASTIC SPORTS INJURY
MEDICAL BENEFITS PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Chicago Board of Education of the City of Chicago acknowledges the importance of providing Chicago Public Schools students with opportunities to participate in interscholastic sports;

WHEREAS, since approximately 1995, to encourage interscholastic sports participation, the District has operated a fully self-insured benefit program that provides students with secondary medical benefits for accidental bodily injuries incurred while involved in covered interscholastic activities, which was modeled on an insured program that preceded it; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to formally establish the terms and conditions of coverage for the Chicago Public Schools' Interscholastic Sports Injury Medical Benefits Program.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHICAGO BOARD OF EDUCATION THAT:

1. The Bureau of Risk Management shall administer the Chicago Public Schools ("CPS") Interscholastic Sports Injury Medical Benefits Program (the "Program") in accordance with the Program provisions set out the attached Exhibit A. The Bureau of Risk Management may utilize the services of a third party administrator for the day to day administration of the Program.
2. The Program provisions set out on Exhibit A shall be effective as of the adoption of this Resolution

Exhibit A

CPS Interscholastic Sports Injury Medical and Funeral Benefits Program

The Chicago Public Schools ("CPS") Interscholastic Sports Injury Medical Benefits Program (the "Program") shall provide medical benefits for accidental bodily injuries and funeral expenses for deaths sustained by CPS students while involved in covered sports activities under the following Program terms and conditions:

I. Definitions

- a. "Accident" or "accidental" means an incident occurring during a Covered Activity resulting in injury or death due to unintended, unforeseeable or unexpected cause(s).
- b. "CPS Student" means a student actively enrolled in a Chicago Public School when the accident occurs. This does not include any student enrolled in a Charter School.
- c. State of Illinois All Kids Program ("All Kids") means the state program that provides uninsured Illinois children with comprehensive healthcare coverage.
- d. "Health Plan" means any insured or self-insured plan or benefit program that covers a student, other than All Kids or this Program, available to pay or partially pay for any healthcare provided to a CPS Student.
- e. "Other Coverage" refers collectively to the coverage provided by All Kids and Health Plans
- f. "Covered Activities" or "Covered Activity" means—
 - i. The scheduled try-outs, practices, games, competitions and events of High School and Elementary Interscholastic Athletics authorized by the Board's Director of Sports Administration, but does not include ordinary school activities, field trips or after school programs;
 - ii. The scheduled training exercises, drill practices, demonstrations, summer camps, cadet challenges and competitions authorized by the Director of JROTC, but not ordinary school activities; and
 - iii. The scheduled drills, summer camps and performances by Marching Band, authorized by the Board's Director of Sports Administration, but not regular band class.

II. Coverage Benefits

- a. The Program provides limited medical benefits for accidental bodily injuries and limited funeral expenses for accidental deaths sustained by CPS Students while involved in Covered Activities.
- b. Secondary Insurance. The benefits of the Program are secondary to all Other Coverage available to the student and are further subject to the following conditions:
 - i. The parent or guardian of a CPS Student without an existing Health Plan or with a Health Plan which does not cover a particular injury or treatment, is required to apply for All Kids coverage and submit medical bills to All Kids before any bills will be considered for payment under this Program. This Program will only pay for the expenses in excess of those expenses that are paid by All Kids, and only to the extent the bills are reasonable and necessary and are within the limits of this Program.

- ii. The parent or guardian of a CPS Student covered under an existing Health Plan(s) is required to submit their child's medical bills to such Health Plan(s) before any bills will be considered for payment under this Program. This Program will only pay for the expenses in excess of those expenses paid by such Health Plan, and only to the extent the bills are reasonable and necessary and are within the limits of this Program. Payment of expenses is further subject to the limitations set out in section II.b.iii. below.
 - iii. If a student is insured by a Health Plan(s) and the CPS Student does not use the facilities or services of the Health Plan(s) or does not follow Health Plan provisions, including but not limited to obtaining preauthorization, this Program will only pay for the expenses in excess of those expenses that would have been paid by the Health Plan(s) if the student had used Health Plan facilities or services and had otherwise followed all Health Plans provisions.
 - iv. The Program will not authorize benefits hereunder until all "Explanations of Benefits" have been issued by all Other Coverage notifying the CPS Student's parent/guardian of the amount payable by all Other Coverage for expenses incurred as a result of accidental bodily injuries sustained by CPS Students during a Covered Activity.
- c. **Medical and Dental Treatment Covered**
- i. Only reasonable and customary medical and dental treatments will be covered under this Program, and then, only to the extent the charges are approved by a Utilization Review undertaken by the Program administrator or its designee. The CPS Student may be required to submit to an Independent Medical Examination selected by the Program administrator or its designee.
 - ii. Treatment must directly relate to the accidental injury sustained during a Covered Activity and treatment must begin within 30 days of the date of accident.
 - iii. Only treatments that occur within 18 months of the date of the Accident will be covered under this Program.
- d. **Funeral expenses.** If an accidental death results during a Covered Activity the Program will provide for reasonable funeral expenses for the CPS Student up to \$5,000.

III. Limits

- a. The maximum benefit payable under the Program for medical and dental expenses is \$25,000 per CPS Student per Accident.
- b. The maximum benefit payable under the Program for funeral expenses is \$5,000 if an Accident results in the death of a CPS Student.

IV. Exclusions

- a. There is no coverage under this Program for non-accidental injuries sustained during Covered Activities, including but not limited to:
 - i. Self-inflicted injuries;
 - ii. Injury contributed to by the use of drugs;
 - iii. Fighting, brawling, riot or civil disorder; and
 - iv. Sickness, illness or disease.
- a. There is no coverage under this Program for medical or dental expenses not considered reasonable and customary, including but not limited to:
 - i. Massage treatments, not related to physical therapy, and
 - ii. Experimental drugs or medical treatments.

V. Documentation

- a. The CPS Student's parent or guardian must initiate a claim for medical, dental or funeral benefits under this Program within 60 calendar days of the Accident in accordance with the procedures identified by the Claims administrator. The parent/guardian must submit all requested claim documentation including, at a minimum, the documents listed below in accordance with the deadlines established by the Program administrator:
 - i. Signed authorizations to obtain medical records itemized.
 - ii. Copies of all medical bills for which payment under this Program is sought.
 - iii. Proof of submission of the medical bills to a Health Plan and/or All Kids.
 - iv. Copies of every Explanation of Benefit issued by the Health Plan(s) and/or All Kids pertaining to each medical bill for which payment is sought under the Program.
 - v. Copies of bills for any funeral expenses for which payment is sought.
- b. A parent/guardian's failure to respond to Program administrator requests for information or documents required to open or process a claim will result in closure of the claim. In no event will a claim remain open 12 months after the Program administrator's last receipt of documentation regarding and Accident or claim.

VI. Amendments

- a. The Bureau of Risk Management is authorized to issue additional procedural materials and Program coverage clarifications for the timely and effective management of the Program.
- b. Any amendments to these Program provisions, including, but not limited to, modification of coverage limits are subject to Board approval.
- c. If any of the provisions of this Program are contradictory to applicable federal, state or local statute, such statute will apply.

VII. Effective Date. The Program provisions specified herein are effective for injuries that occur after December 15, 2010.

WHEREAS, the Governance Policy authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to recommend to the Board candidates to fill seats on ALSCs from among the candidates in non-binding polls and recommended by the principal or CAO or any other candidates selected by the Chief Executive Officer.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original agreement (authorized by Board Report 09-0624-EX8) in the amount of \$100,000.00 was for a term commencing July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2010, with the Board having five (5) options to renew for a period of one (1) year each. The agreement was amended (authorized by Board Report 10-0526-EX2) to increase the compensation amount to \$346,000.00. The original agreement was awarded on a non-competitive basis.

OPTION PERIOD: The term of this agreement is being extended for one (1) year commencing July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2011.

OPTION PERIODS REMAINING: There are (4) four options to renew for a period of one (1) of year each remaining.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: AUSL, in partnership with leadership teams of Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr, and Solorio will establish dual mission teacher training schools to train and develop teacher residents working towards a Master of Arts in Teaching degree. Teacher residents will complete a year-long residency at each of the following schools: Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr, and Solorio, working in close partnership with mentor teachers to develop and refine their teaching expertise. The resident teacher candidates will be recruited and selected by AUSL, and will provide approximately 500 hours each of assistance to the classrooms of the participating schools 4 days per week in exchange for a stipend paid by AUSL. AUSL will also provide school management consulting services, which includes support in personnel selection, curriculum decisions, budget allocations and other aspects of high quality school management to the principals of Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr, and Solorio. There is no obligation on part of the Board to hire any graduating participants. The decision to hire any graduating participants is solely within the discretion of the Board.

THE BOARD'S RESPONSIBILITIES: The Board will allocate funding to cover the program costs of hiring 1.0 and 2.0 positions, and extended day salary expenses to support implementation of this program. AUSL will make recommendations to the Board as to the various positions to be filled in each school. The Professional Development Schools programs is allocated funds at a rate of \$20,000 per teacher resident for residents seeking certification in high need subject areas, and \$15,000 per teacher resident for residents seeking certification in all other subject areas. An additional program allocation of \$300,000 is made for each participating school that hosts 10 or more teacher residents during a single school year.

DELIVERABLES: AUSL will deliver a top-quality professional development program at Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr, and Solorio which will include:

- Rigorous instructional training for pre-service resident teacher candidates and other in-service teacher programs at Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr, and Solorio
- Innovative approaches to instructional practice that serves as a resource to the staff members and administration of Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr and Solorio as well as for the District as a whole.
- Creative strategies, incentives, and supports to attract and retain certified, highly qualified experienced, and award-winning educators at Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr and Solorio.
- An evaluation of the effectiveness of integration of professional development into curricula and instruction, ultimately increasing instructional capacity at Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr, and Solorio.
- A mechanism and infrastructure to facilitate sharing of best practices and innovations

OUTCOMES: AUSL services will result in a high-quality teacher preparation program that serves as a model for urban teacher development.

In 2010-2011, Dodge, TCA, NTA, Tarkington, CAHS, Collins, Orr, and Solorio will be staffed in CPS schools for no less than a period of four years.

At least 80% of residents that complete the program will be staffed in CPS schools for no less than a period of four years.

The CPS mentor will deepen their capacity to provide mentoring over the course of the year, as measured by evaluations performed by AUSL staff members

COMPENSATION: AUSL shall be paid the balance remaining from the total Professional Development Schools budget that is not allocated to cover the costs of hiring 1.0 and 0.2 positions, and extended day salary buckets at CPS schools. The total compensation payable to AUSL for the option period shall not exceed \$1,295,080.40. These funds will be paid out using both Title II and CPS Funds. This program is also funded by approximately \$2 Million that AUSL has raised from sources outside of Chicago Public Schools.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original Charter School Agreement (authorized by Board Report 97-1217-EX2) was for a term commencing July 1, 1998 and ending June 30, 2004 and authorized the operation of a charter school serving no more than 750 students in grades K – 12. The charter school was located at 3141 W. Jackson. The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2009 (authorized by Board Report 04-0225-EX2)

The agreement incorporates an accountability plan where the school is evaluated by the Board each year based on numerous factors related to its academic, financial and operational performance

CHARTER RENEWAL PROPOSAL: Alain Locke ~~Charter Academy~~ Charter School submitted a renewal proposal on September 5, 2008, to continue the operation of the Alain Locke ~~Charter Academy~~ Charter School under a unified mission. The Charter School shall serve grades K -8 with a maximum student enrollment of 617 students.

The original charter school agreement authorized serving students in grades 9 through 12. The charter school will be required to submit a proposal through the New Schools Selection Process for evaluation and Board approval, and a public hearing will be required before being authorized to serve high school students.

Alain Locke ~~Charter Academy~~ Charter School has operated a pre-kindergarten program since 2005. The current authorization for this program is pursuant to Board Report No. 08-0602-ED3 #6. The Board supports the continuation of the pre-kindergarten program at Alain Locke ~~Charter Academy~~ Charter School for the duration of the charter school renewal term, subject to the availability of funding and applicable state laws and regulations. The pre-kindergarten program will continue to be funded pursuant to separate agreements consistent with procedures established by the Office of Early Childhood Education.

In November 2010, Alain Locke notified the Office of New Schools that the name of the charter school was incorrect. This amendment reflects the correct name for Alain Locke.

CHARTER EVALUATION: After receiving the charter renewal proposal, the Office of New Schools conducted a comprehensive evaluation of Alain Locke's performance and operations. This evaluation included a review of the proposal, facilities surveys, governance analysis, and financial analysis. A public hearing was conducted on Thursday, April 16, 2009 to receive public comment on the application to renew the Charter School Agreement with Alain Locke ~~Charter Academy~~ Charter School for an additional five years. In addition, the Office of New Schools evaluated the school's student performance. From 2004-2005 to 2007-2008, Alain Locke ~~Charter Academy~~ Charter School received 16 out of 23 high ratings and 6 out of 23 middle ratings on their absolute student indicators found in the framework put forth by the district for assessing charter school pupil performance. From 2004-2005 to 2006-2008, Alain Locke's

student attendance averaged 93.2%. From 2005-2006 to 2006-2008 the percentage of students meeting/exceeding state standards on the ISAT Composite increased by 8.9 percentage points (from 72.1% to 81.0%). The charter school also met Adequate Yearly Progress targets for all years eligible (2004-2005 through 2007-2008). The committee recommends that, based on the school's performance on these and other accountability criteria, Alain Locke be authorized to continue operating as a charter school.

RENEWAL TERM: The term of Alain Locke Charter Academy Charter School's charter status is being extended for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2014

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include relevant terms and conditions, including any indemnities to be provided to the charter school, in the written Charter School Agreement, which shall reflect resolution of any and all outstanding issues between the Board and the governing body of the charter school including, but not limited to: site location, enrollment, funding, educational program, financial controls and practices, academic accountability and evaluations. ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original Charter School Agreement (authorized by Board Report 97-1217-EX2) was for a term commencing July 1, 1998 and ending June 30, 2003 and authorized the operation of a charter school serving no more than 800 students in grades K – 8 on two campuses. The campus serving grades K – 3 was located at 2651 W. 23rd Street. The campus serving grades 4 – 8 was located at 2401 W. Congress. The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2003 and ending June 30, 2008 (authorized by Board Report 03-0225-EX7) and authorized an increase in the maximum student enrollment to permit 1060 students in grades Pre-K – 8. The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently amended as follows:

- Board Report 05-0622-EX2: Approved the establishment of a new campus (Rufino Tamayo Campus) located at 5157 S. California and an increase of the enrollment cap to 1310. Also approved the change in charter school name from Octavio Paz Charter School to UNO Charter School.
- Board Report 05-1026-EX2: Approved the address correction for the Rufino Tamayo Campus to 5135 S. California.
- Board Report 06-0222-EX15: Approved the establishment of 2 new elementary campuses and to increase the at capacity enrollment of the Rufino Tamayo Campus to 297. The Bartolome de Las Casas Campus is located at 1641 W. 16th Street and was approved to open serving a maximum student enrollment of 261 students in grades K – 8. The Carlos Fuentes Campus is located at 2845 W. Barry and was approved to open a maximum student enrollment of 504 students in grades K – 8. The UNO Charter School enrollment cap increased to 2122 students.
- Board Report 06-1115-EX4: Approved the establishment of 4 additional campuses. The first campus (Brighton Park) is located at 2916 W. 47th Street, serves an at capacity of 522 students in grades K – 8. All remaining campuses are located at 4248 W. 47th Street. Two campuses (Archer Heights – North and Archer Heights – South) will serve a total of 522 students each in grades K – 8. The 3rd Archer Heights Campus will serve a total of 522 students in grades 9 – 12. The UNO Charter School enrollment cap increased to 4210 students.
- Board Report 07-0124-EX2: Approved the correction of the start date of the Brighton Park Campus to 2007.
- Board Report 07-0822-EX7: Approved the name change of the UNO Charter School - Brighton Park Campus to UNO Charter School – Officer Donald J. Marquez Campus.
- Board Report 07-0928-EX3: Approved the correction of the at capacity enrollment of the Bartolome de las Casas Campus to 297, the correction of the at capacity enrollment of the Carlos Fuentes campus to 576, and the correction of the entire enrollment capacity for all campuses to 4318.

The agreement incorporates an accountability plan where the school is evaluated by the board each year based on numerous factors related to its academic, financial and operational performance.

CHARTER RENEWAL PROPOSAL: UNO Charter School Network (UNO) submitted a renewal proposal on October 5, 2007, to continue the operation of the UNO Charter School under a unified mission. UNO has since modified its renewal proposal to include commitments to operate the eight (8) campuses unified through the use of uniform assessment plans and performance standards, curriculum and school calendar alignment, as well as standard governance, operational, employment, educational and admissions policies. The Charter School shall serve grades K - 12 with a maximum student enrollment of 4318 students.

In addition, the UNO Charter School Network was awarded pre-qualified status for a term commencing January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2011 to provide designated services in the form of opening a maximum of four (4) schools or campuses during the awarded pre-qualification period, with a maximum number of two (2) schools or campuses per year (authorized by Board Report 07-1114-EX4). Award of a subsequent agreement to UNO for the opening of these additional campuses during this pre-qualification period is contingent upon the school operator submitting timely responses to requests for additional information (RFI), in addition to the school operator meeting specific requirements as outlined in Board Report 07-1114-EX4.

UNO Charter School Network also submitted a material modification in February of 2008 to (a) formally recognize the existing Octavio Paz Primary Campus located at 2651 W. 23rd Street and the existing Octavio Paz Intermediate Campus located at 2401 W. Congress each as its own campus with an at capacity enrollment not to exceed 530 at each campus, (b) increase the at capacity enrollment of the Officer Donald J. Marquez, Archer Heights – North, Archer Heights – South and Archer Heights High School Campuses each to 600 and (c) increase the at capacity enrollment of the entire UNO Charter School Network from 4318 to 4630.

On June 28, 2008, UNO Charter School Network submitted a proposal in response to the Renaissance 2010 Request for Proposals to open two new campuses as a part of their pre-qualified status (authorized by Board Report 07-1114-EX4). It is anticipated that the new campuses will be located at the intersection of South Homan Avenue and 51st Street where UNO Charter School Network will begin construction of a new facility to house both campuses. UNO Charter School Network proposes to establish the UNO Charter School – Gage Park Campus, an elementary school expected to open at full capacity in the fall of 2009, serving 600 students in grades K-8. UNO Charter School Network proposes to establish the UNO Charter School – Academy High

School Campus, expected to open in the fall of 2010, serving 150 students in grades 9 That campus will grow to serve an at capacity enrollment of 600 students in grades 9 through 12. The at capacity enrollment of the entire UNO Charter School Network will increase by 1200 students to 5830 A public hearing, as required by statute, was held on September 3, 2008 and an additional community form was held on September 16th

The UNO Charter School Network is authorized to operate a pre-kindergarten program in the same building as the charter school. The children enrolled in the pre-kindergarten will not be included in the enrollment of the charter school and the pre-kindergarten program will not be governed by the charter school agreement To the extent the Board provides funding for the pre-kindergarten program, that program will be subject to a separate agreement with and separate funding authorized by the Office of Early Childhood Education. A material breach of any contract between the Board and UNO Charter School Network for operation of a pre-kindergarten program or the charter school may be treated as a breach of the other contract

In July 2009, the UNO Charter School Network submitted a material modification to (a) change the names of the UNO Charter School – Archer Heights North Campus to the SPC Daniel Zizumbo Campus, UNO Charter School – Archer Heights South Campus to the PFC Omar E. Torres Campus, and the UNO Charter School – Archer Heights High School Campus to the Major Hector P. Garcia MD Campus; (b) identify the former De La Cruz facility at 2317 W. 23rd Place as a temporary location for the UNO Charter School – Octavio Paz Primary and Intermediate Campuses for the 2009-2010 school year only; (c) temporarily adjust the at capacity enrollment for the Octavio Paz Campuses for the 2009 – 2010 school year to 305 for the Primary Campus and 175 for the Intermediate Campus; (d) change the grade structure for the Octavio Paz Primary Campus to serve grades K through 5 and for the Octavio Paz Intermediate Campus to serve grades 6 through 8, and (e) change the start date for the UNO Charter School – Gage Park Campus from 2009 to 2010. A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Friday, August 21, 2009. The hearing was recorded and a summary of the hearing is available for review.

On July 15, 2009, UNO Charter School Network submitted a proposal in response to the Renaissance 2010 Request for Proposals to open one new campus as a part of its pre-qualified status (authorized by Board Report 07-1114-EX4). The new campus is expected to open at full capacity in the fall of 2011 serving 600 students in grades K-8 at a site to be determined. The overall at capacity enrollment of the UNO Charter School Network will increase by 600 students to 6430 for the 2011-2012 school year. Public hearings, as required by statute were held on June 23, 2009, September 10, 2009 and November 9, 2009 The public hearings were recorded and summary reports for all hearings are available for review.

In March 2010 UNO Charter School Network submitted a material modification to (a) identify the independent facility at 2744 W. Pershing as the location for the UNO Charter School – Gage Park Campus, (b) identify the independent facility at 2651 W. 23rd Street as the permanent location for the UNO Charter School – Octavio Paz Campus, and (c) consolidate the UNO Charter School – Octavio Paz Primary Campus and the UNO Charter School – Octavio Paz Intermediate Campus into one attendance center identified by one unit number serving grades K-8. A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Tuesday, April 20, 2010 The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In April 2010 UNO Charter School Network submitted a material modification to change the start date of the UNO Charter School – Academy High School Campus from fall 2010 to fall 2011. UNO Charter School Network also submitted a material modification to modify the at capacity enrollments at various UNO Charter School Campuses. The campuses and respective at capacity enrollment changes are listed in the table below A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Wednesday, May 12, 2010. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In August 2010 UNO Charter School Network submitted a proposal to do the following: (a) establish one new campus to open in the fall of 2011 at a location to be determined, (b) increase the at capacity enrollment of the charter school by 630 to 7060 in the fall of 2011, (c) establish two new campuses to open in the fall of 2012 at locations to be determined, (d) increase the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school by 1260 to 8320 in the fall of 2012 (e) change the name of the Academy High School Campus to the 51st and St. Louis Charter School Campus, (f) change the start date of the UNO Charter School – Academy High School Campus from fall 2011 to fall 2012, (g) increase the grades served at the Academy High School Campus to serve grades 6 through 12 and (h) increase the at capacity enrollment of the Academy High School Campus by 120 students to a new at capacity enrollment of 720 and (i) further increase the at capacity enrollment of the charter school by 120 students to 8440 in the fall of 2012. A public hearing on these proposed changes was held on December 13, 2010.

Once the new Gage Park and Academy High Campuses anticipated to open in the fall of 2010 and the fall of 2011 respectively are ready for occupancy, the Office of New Schools will propose amended Board Reports providing the full address for each of those campuses. The Charter School Agreement will be amended consistent with those amended Board Reports.

CONTINGENT APPROVAL: Approval to open the two new elementary school campuses in the fall of 2011, two new elementary school campuses and one high school campus in the fall of 2012 and the execution of an amendment to the Charter School Agreement are contingent upon a final review and approval of the new elementary school and high school campus proposals, an assessment of the District's need for this charter school campuses based upon demographics and student demands, any required subsequent public hearings, and Board approval of the proposed school site. These benchmarks will be communicated to the school operator in a formal Letter of Conditions with all deadlines to be met by March 15, 2011 for 2011 campuses and March 15, 2012 for 2012 campuses. The Office of New Schools will oversee the enforcement of these deadlines; failure to meet these deadlines may, at the option of the Board, result in the rescission of the authority granted herein and the denial of the approval to open this new campus. A final review of this new campus proposal will be conducted by the Chief Executive Officer on or before April 15, 2011 or April 15, 2012 to determine final approval or denial of the new campus proposal and satisfactory resolution of all material issues related to the opening of the new elementary school campus.

The obligation to secure and prepare an independent facility for the two elementary school campuses opening in the fall of 2011, two new elementary school campuses and one high school campus in the fall of 2012 is the responsibility of the charter school. The Board is not undertaking any responsibility for securing a facility in the event the charter school is unable to do so.

CHARTER EVALUATION: After receiving the charter renewal proposal, the Office of New Schools conducted a comprehensive evaluation of UNO's performance and operations. This evaluation included a review of the proposal, facilities surveys, financial analysis, and academic site visits of the three campuses in which teaching and learning, leadership and governance, and the learning communities were assessed. Public hearings were conducted on January 9, 2008 and May 13, 2008 to receive public comment on the application to renew the Charter School Agreement with UNO Charter School Network for an additional five years. There was no public testimony, oral or written, from anyone in opposition of the renewal of UNO Charter School. In addition, the Office of New Schools evaluated the school's student performance. From 2003-2004 to 2006-2007, UNO received 22 out of 38 high ratings and 16 out of 38 middle ratings on their absolute student indicators found in the framework put forth by the district for assessing charter school pupil performance. Since 2003-2004, the charter schools attendance rate has averaged 94%. From 2003-2004 to 2006-2007, the percentage of students meeting/exceeding state standards on the ISAT Composite has increased by 10.3 percentage points (61.3% of students meeting/exceeding state standards to 71.6%). The charter school also met Adequate Yearly Progress targets for four consecutive years (2003-04 to 2006-07). Looking across all of the school performance indicators, UNO Charter School can be categorized as "Meeting Standards" for achieving pupil performance standards using the framework put forth by the district for assessing charter school pupil performance. The Office of New Schools recommends that, based on the school's performance on these and other accountability criteria, UNO Charter School be authorized to continue operating as a charter school.

RENEWAL TERM: The term of UNO Charter School Network's charter agreement is being extended for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2008 and ending June 30, 2013.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include relevant terms and conditions, including any indemnities to be provided to the charter school, in the written Charter School Agreement and amendment which shall reflect resolution of any and all outstanding issues between the Board and the governing body of the charter school including, but not limited to: site location, enrollment, funding, educational program, financial controls and practices, academic accountability and evaluations. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the Charter School Agreement and amendment. Authorize the Acting Executive Officer of the Office of New Schools to issue a letter notifying the Illinois State Board of Education of the action (s) approved hereunder and to submit the approved proposal and signed Charter School Agreement to the Illinois State Board of Education for certification.

LSC REVIEW: Approval of Local School Councils is not applicable to this report

FINANCIAL: The financial implications will be addressed during the development of the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 fiscal year budgets. Since the School Code of Illinois prohibits the incurring of any liability unless an appropriation has been previously made, expenditures beyond FY11 are deemed to be contingent liabilities only, subject to appropriation in subsequent fiscal year budgets. The cost of UNO Charter School's total enrollment will be approximately \$32,910,000.00 in 2010-2011. If UNO Charter School applies to the Renaissance Schools Fund for funding for the new elementary school campus opening in the fall of 2011 and is not approved for such funding, the Board shall provide a one-time payment to the campus for planning positions in an amount not to exceed \$170,000.00.

Inspector General - Each Party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the Provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3, which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board members during the one-year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's indebtedness Policy adopted June 26, 1996 (96-0626-PO3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

From 2005-2006 to 2008-2009, Erie's student attendance averaged 94.3%. In 2009 the percentage of students meeting/exceeding state standards on the ISAT Composite was 64.7%. The committee recommends that, based on the school's performance on these and other accountability criteria, Erie be authorized to continue operating as a charter school.

RENEWAL TERM: The term of Erie Elementary Charter School's charter status is being extended for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2015.

**APPROVE THE RENEWAL OF THE CHARTER SCHOOL AGREEMENT WITH
PERSPECTIVES CHARTER SCHOOL**

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Approve the renewal of the Charter School Agreement with Perspectives Charter School for an additional five-year period. A new Charter School Agreement applicable to this renewal term will be negotiated. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education. Information pertinent to this renewal is stated below

This October 2007 amended Board Report is necessary to (a) authorize the Perspectives Charter School to increase the at capacity enrollments from 500 to 540 at the following campuses for the 2007 -- 2008 school year: Calumet High School Campus, the Calumet Middle School Campus, and the Calumet School of Technology; and (b) increase the enrollment cap of Perspectives Charter School for all campuses by 120 students to 2020 for the 2007 -- 2008 school year. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This October 2007 amended Board Report is also necessary to (a) authorize Perspectives Charter School to add two new campuses in the fall of 2008, the Math and Science Academy Campus at a location yet to be determined with an enrollment cap of 580 and the Chicago Lawn Campus at a location yet to be determined with an enrollment cap of 600; and (b) increase the enrollment cap of Perspectives Charter School for all campuses by 1180 students to 3200 students for the 2008 -- 2009 school year. The addition of the new campuses and the corresponding changes to enrollment is contingent upon the charter school meeting certain benchmarks established by the Office of New Schools as detailed below, any required public hearings and Board approval of the location of the new campuses. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed within the time specified in an amended Board Report(s) approving the site(s). The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This March 2008 amendment is necessary to (a) identify a site for the Math and Science Academy Campus opening in the Fall of 2008 and (b) authorize Perspectives Charter School to change the opening of the Chicago Lawn Campus to open in the Fall of 2009. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education. Further Board approval will be required to approve the site for the Chicago Lawn Campus.

This July 2008 amendment is necessary to (a) change the name of the Perspectives Charter School -- South Loop Campus, (b) to increase the first year at capacity enrollment of the Perspectives Charter School -- Math and Science Academy Campus by 27 students to 270 and (c) to correct the grades served at the Perspectives -- Calumet High School Campus to grades 9 -- 12. A written amendment to the charter school agreement is required. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment is not executed within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The amendment authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This February 2009 amendment is necessary to a) change the grades served at the Perspectives Charter School – Calumet Middle School Campus from 7 through 8 to 6 through 8 and b) change the opening of the Chicago Lawn Campus from the fall of 2009 to a date to be determined. A written amendment to the charter school agreement is required. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment is not executed within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The amendment authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This September 2010 amendment is necessary to (a) change the name of the Perspectives Charter School – Calumet Middle School Campus to Perspectives Charter School – Middle Academy Campus, (b) change the name of the Perspectives Charter School – Calumet School of Technology to Perspectives Charter School – High School of Technology and (c) change the name of the Perspectives Charter School – Calumet High School Campus to Perspectives Charter School – Leadership Academy. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This December 2010 amendment is necessary to (a) increase the at capacity enrollment of the High School of Technology Campus by 60 to a new at capacity of 600, (b) increase the at capacity enrollment of the Math and Science Academy Campus by 170 to a new at capacity of 750, and (c) increase the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school by 230 to 2830 in the fall of 2011. The granting of enrollment increases for charter schools in CPS facilities does not commit the Board to provide funding for capital improvements at these facilities. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original Charter School Agreement (authorized by Board Report 97-0122-EX4) was for a term commencing July 1, 1997 and ending June 30, 2002 and authorized the operation of a charter school focusing on college preparation and character development for students in grades 6-12. The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2007 (authorized by Board Report 01-1128-EX2), and subsequently amended as follows:

- Board Report 05-0727-EX11: Approved the expansion into a new facility located at 1930 South Archer Avenue and increased the maximum student enrollment to 400
- Board Report 05-1116-EX11: Approved the establishment of an additional campus located at 8131 S. May Street (Perspectives Calumet High School) to open in the Fall of 2006 and to increase the school's enrollment cap by 756, for a maximum enrollment cap of 1156 students
- Board Report 06-0222-EX13: Approved a change in the opening enrollment number and grades of the Perspectives Calumet High School from 216 students in grades 6 and 9 to 270 students in grades 7 and 9 and changed the grades to be served from 6 to 12 to 7 to 12
- Board Report 06-0524-EX8: Approved the establishment of two additional campuses to open in the Fall of 2007 contingent upon renewal of the Charter Agreement: a) the Perspectives Charter School - Calumet Middle School Campus to open with 375 students in grades 7 - 8 and a future maximum enrollment of 500 students and b) the Perspectives Charter School - Calumet School of Technology to open with 200 students in grades 9 and 10 and a future maximum enrollment of 500 students in grades 9 - 12, and an increase in the school's enrollment cap to 1900 students.

The agreement incorporates an accountability plan where the school is evaluated by the board each year based on numerous factors related to its academic, financial and operational performance.

CHARTER RENEWAL PROPOSAL: Perspectives submitted a renewal proposal on December 1, 2006, to continue the operation of the Perspectives Charter School under a unified mission. Perspectives has since modified its renewal proposal to include commitments to operate four (4) campuses as one unified school through the use of uniform assessment plans and performance standards, curriculum and school calendar alignment, as well as standard governance, operational, employment, educational and admissions policies. The Charter School shall serve grades 6-12 with a maximum student enrollment of 1,900.

On August 6, 2007 Perspectives submitted a Renaissance Proposal to (a) establish two new campuses in the fall of 2008 and (b) to increase their at capacity enrollment by 1180 students to 3080 students. The Perspectives Charter School - Math and Science Academy Campus will open in 2008 and serve approximately 243 students in grades 6,7 and 9. The Perspectives Charter School - Chicago Lawn Campus will open in 2008 and serve approximately 600 students in grades 6-8 and 10-12. A public hearing was held on October 13, 2007.

In October 2007, Perspectives also submitted a material modification to (a) increase the at capacity enrollment from 500 to 540 students at the following campuses: Calumet High School Campus, Calumet Middle School Campus and Calumet School of Technology Campus and (b) increase the enrollment cap by 120 students to 2020 for the 2007 - 2008 school year. 2007 - 2008 maximum enrollment for the listed campuses is indicated below.

In February 2008, Perspectives submitted a material modification to (a) identify a site for the Math and Science Academy Campus to be located at 3663 S. Wabash Avenue and (b) to change the opening of the Chicago Lawn Campus from 2008 to 2009. A public hearing as required by statute was held on March 18, 2008 at 3663 S. Wabash. The hearing was recorded and a summary report of the hearing is available for review.

In June 2008, Perspectives submitted a material modification to (a) change the name of the Perspectives Charter School - South Loop Campus to the Perspectives Charter School - Rodney D. Joslin Campus and (b) increase the first year at capacity enrollment of the Perspectives Charter School - Math and Science Academy Campus by 27 students to a new total of 270 students.

The correct at capacity grades for the Perspectives Charter School - Calumet High School Campus are 9 - 12. A public hearing as required by statute was held on July 16, 2008 at 125 S. Clark Street. A summary report of the hearing is available for review.

In December 2008 Perspectives submitted a material modification to change the grades served at the Perspectives Charter School - Calumet Middle School Campus from 7 through 8 to 6 through 8. A public hearing as required by statute was held on February 17, 2009 at 125 S. Clark Street. A summary report of the hearing is available for review.

In August 2010 Perspectives submitted a material modification to change the names of the following: (a) the Perspectives Charter School - Calumet Middle School Campus to Perspectives Charter School -

Middle Academy Campus, (b) the Perspectives Charter School - Calumet School of Technology to Perspectives Charter School - High School of Technology and (c) the Perspectives Charter School - Calumet High School Campus to Perspectives Charter School - Leadership Academy. A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Thursday, September 9, 2010. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In October 2010 Perspectives submitted a material modification to (a) increase the at capacity enrollment of the High School of Technology Campus by 60 to a new at capacity of 600, (b) increase the at capacity enrollment of the Math and Science Academy Campus by 170 to a new at capacity of 750, and (c) increase the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school by 230 to 2830 in the fall of 2011. A public hearing on the proposed change was held on December 13, 2010.

CONTINGENT APPROVAL: The addition of the two new campuses anticipated to open in the fall of 2008 and the corresponding changes to enrollment is contingent upon any required subsequent public hearings and Board approval of the proposed sites for the new campuses. Approval of the 2008 campuses is also contingent upon Perspectives Charter School meeting benchmarks established by the Office of New Schools on or before April 15, 2008. The Office of New Schools will oversee the enforcement of these deadlines. Failure by Perspectives Charter School to meet these deadlines, at the option of the Board, may result in the rescission of the authority granted herein and the denial of the approval of the 2008 campuses. A final review of the charter school proposal for the 2008 campuses will be conducted by the Chief Executive Officer on or before May 15, 2008. This final review will be conducted to determine compliance with the terms indicated above. The CEO's recommendation to approve the 2008 campuses will be subject to Board approval as indicated by a subsequent amendment to this Board Report.

CHARTER EVALUATION: After receiving the charter renewal proposal, the Office of New Schools conducted a comprehensive evaluation of Perspectives's performance and operations. This evaluation included a review of the proposal, facilities surveys, financial analysis, and academic site visits of both Perspectives campuses in which teaching and learning, leadership and governance, and the learning communities were assessed. In addition to the foregoing, the Office of New Schools evaluated the school's student performance. From 2002 to 2006, Perspectives received 36 out of 73 high ratings and 30 out of 73 middle ratings on their student absolute indicators. In 2006, 68% of Perspectives students met or exceeded state standards on the ISAT. Finally, the school experienced a high attendance rate of 93.1% in 2005-2006. The committee recommends that, based on the schools performance on these and other accountability criteria, that Perspectives be authorized to continue operating as a charter school.

RENEWAL TERM: The term of Perspectives charter status is being extended for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2007 and ending June 30, 2012.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include relevant terms and conditions, including any indemnities to be provided to the charter school, in the written Charter School Agreement, which shall reflect resolution of any and all outstanding issues between the Board and the governing body of the charter school including, but not limited to: site location, enrollment, funding, educational program, financial controls and practices, academic accountability and evaluations. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the Charter School Agreement. Authorize the Interim Executive Officer of the Office of New Schools to issue a letter notifying the Illinois State Board of Education of the action (s) approved hereunder and to submit the approved proposal and signed Charter School Agreement to the Illinois State Board of Education for certification.

LSC REVIEW: Approval of Local School Councils is not applicable to this report.

FINANCIAL: The financial implications will be addressed during the development of the ~~2008-2009~~ 2011-2012 fiscal year budget. Since the School Code of Illinois prohibits the incurring of any liability unless an appropriation has been previously made, expenditures beyond FY08 are deemed to be contingent liabilities only, subject to appropriation in subsequent fiscal year budgets. The cost of this enrollment will be approximately \$1,910,223.00 in 2008 -2009.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Inspector General - Each Party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the Provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3, which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board members during the one-year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's indebtedness Policy adopted June 26, 1996 (96-0626-P03), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted June 23, 2004 (04-0623-PO4), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING:

Approve the renewal of the Charter School Agreement with Noble Network of Charter Schools for an additional five-year period. A new Charter School Agreement applicable to this renewal term will be negotiated. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education. Information pertinent to this renewal is stated below. The authority to open the three (3) new campuses for which sites have not yet been identified and the corresponding increase in the maximum enrollment is contingent upon Board approval of the sites via an amended Board Report

This March 2009 amendment is necessary to authorize the Noble Network of Charter Schools to identify a location for the Chicago Bulls College Prep Campus at 2040 W. Adams. The CEO asks that the Board grant a waiver from the Charter School Capital and Facility Budget Policy, 08-0326-PO1 as the notice to use this location was only five days late due to the need to finalize details related to renovations costs and present accurate data. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education

This April 2009 amendment is necessary to authorize the Noble Network of Charter Schools to (a) identify a location for the Bain NUSH Grammar School Campus at 1454 W. Superior, (b) increase the first year enrollment of the Chicago Bulls College Prep Campus by 30 seats to 230, and (c) increase the first year enrollment of the Muchin College Prep Campus by 80 seats to 280. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This August 2009 amendment is necessary to (a) approve the withdrawal of the Noble Street Charter School - Bain NUSH Grammar School Campus proposal, (b) decrease the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school by 600 to 5,396, and (c) correct the address of the Noble Street Charter School - Golder College Prep Campus. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This November 2009 amendment is necessary to authorize the Noble Network of Charter Schools to (a) establish a new campus in the fall of 2010 to be located at 6350 S. Stewart, (b) increase the overall at capacity enrollment by 600 to 5,996 students, and (c) approve the withdrawal of the Noble Street Charter School - Osborn College Prep Campus. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education

This April 2010 amendment is necessary to authorize the Noble Network of Charter Schools to (a) increase the at capacity enrollment of the Noble Charter School Pritzker Campus by 151 students to an at capacity enrollment of 750 and (b) increase the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter by 151 students to 6,147 students. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education

This September 2010 amendment is necessary to approve changing the name of the Noble Street Charter School - Englewood Campus to the Noble Street Charter School - John and Eunice Johnson College Prep Campus. A written amendment to the original Charter School Agreement is required. This amendment is also necessary to approve entering into an Amended and Restatement Charter School Agreement to incorporate revisions to the existing Charter School Agreement and Accountability Plan. The authority granted herein for the Amended and Restated Charter School Agreement and amendment to the original Charter School Agreement shall automatically rescind as to both in the event such agreements are not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. Each agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education

This December 2010 amendment is necessary to authorize the Noble Network of Charter Schools to (a) add grades 6 through 8 to the Noble Street Charter School – Gary Comer College Prep Campus, (b) increase the at capacity enrollment of the Noble Street Charter School – Gary Comer College Prep Campus by 200 students to a new at capacity enrollment of 800 students and to (c) increase the at capacity enrollment of the entire Noble Network of Charter Schools by 200 students to a new at capacity enrollment of 6347 students.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original Charter School Agreement (authorized by Board Report 98-0429-EX12) was for a term commencing July 2, 1998 (with the charter school opening for the 1999 – 2000 school year) and ending June 30, 2004 and authorized the operation of a charter school serving no more than 500 students in grades 9 – 12. The charter school was located at 1010 North Noble Street. The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2009 (authorized by Board Report 04-0225-EX3). The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently amended as follows:

- Board Report 05-1116-EX8: Approved the establishment of 2 new campuses located at 4131 West Cortland Avenue (Cortland Campus) and 1337 West Ohio Street (Ohio Campus) and an increase of the enrollment cap to 1698. Also approved the change in charter school holder from Noble Street Charter School to Noble Network of Charter Schools
- Board Report 06-0927-EX4: Approved the name change for the Cortland Campus to the Pritzker Campus and for the Ohio Campus to the Rauner Campus.
- Board Report 06-1115-EX5: Approved the establishment of 2 new high school campuses and to increase the overall at capacity enrollment by 1,198. The Brown Campus is located at 1460 West Superior Street and will serve a maximum student enrollment of 599 students in grades 9-12. The Maroon Campus is located at 3645 West Chicago Avenue and will serve a maximum student enrollment of 599 students in grades 9-12. The Noble Network of Charter Schools enrollment cap increased to 2,896 students.
- Board Report 07-0627-EX5: Approved the name change for the Brown Campus to the Golder College Prep Campus and the Maroon Campus to the Rowe-Clark Math & Science Academy Campus.

Noble Street has since modified its renewal proposal to include commitments to operate the eleven (11) campuses unified through the use of uniform assessment plans and performance standards, curriculum and school calendar alignment, as well as standard governance, operational, employment, educational and admissions policies. The Charter School shall serve grades K - 12 with a maximum student enrollment of 4796 students and 6596 upon subsequent Board approval of the location of the three (3) campuses with sites to be determined.

In March 2009, the Board proposed the location for the Noble Street Charter School – Chicago Bulls College Prep Campus. The Chicago Bulls College Prep Campus will be located at 2040 W. Adams. A public hearing for the proposed location was held on March 18, 2009 at Best Practices High School, located at 2040 W Adams. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

This site will require that the Chicago Bulls College Prep Campus share its facility with Best Practices High School. The two schools will share their facility in accordance with the Board's Shared Facility Policy, 05-0126-PO1.

In April 2009, the Noble Network of Charter Schools identified a location for the Bain NUSH Grammar School Campus. The Bain NUSH Grammar School Campus will be located at 1454 W. Superior. Noble Network of Charter Schools also submitted a material modification to increase the first year enrollment of the Chicago Bulls College Prep Campus by 30 seats to 230, and to increase the first year enrollment of the Muchin College Prep Campus by 80 seats to 280. A public hearing for the proposed location and enrollment increase was held on Monday, April 20, 2009. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In August 2009, the Noble Network of Charter Schools notified the Office of New Schools that it would like to withdraw its proposal to open the Bain NUSH Grammar School Campus and change the overall at capacity enrollment for the charter school. A public hearing for this proposed change was held on Monday, August 17 2009. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In addition, the Noble Network of Charter Schools submitted a material modification to correct the address of the Golder College Prep Campus. The correct address for the Golder College Prep Campus is 1454 W Superior.

On July 15, 2009, the Noble Network of Charter Schools submitted a proposal to open a new high school. Noble Network proposes to establish the Noble Street Charter School – Englewood Campus to be located at 6350 S Stewart and to increase the overall at capacity enrollment by 600 students to 5,996. This site will require that Noble Street Charter School – Englewood Campus share its facility with Reed Elementary School. The two schools will share their facility in accordance with the Board's Shared Facility Policy, 05-0126-PO1. The Englewood Campus is scheduled to open in the fall of 2010 and will serve 150 students in grade 9. In successive years, the Englewood Campus will grow one grade at a time, until reaching a capacity of 600 students in grades 9-12. Public hearings, as required by statute, were held on June 23, 2009, September 10 2009 and November 9, 2009. The public hearings were recorded and summary reports for all hearings are available for review.

In February 2010, the Noble Network of Charter Schools submitted a material modification to (a) increase the at capacity enrollment of the Noble Charter School Pritzker Campus by 151 students to an at capacity enrollment of 750 and (b) increase the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter by 151 students to 6,147 students. A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on April 15, 2010. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In July 2010, the Noble Network of Charter Schools submitted a material modification to change the name of the Noble Street Charter School – Englewood Campus to the Noble Street Charter School – John and Eunice Johnson College Prep Campus. A public hearing on the proposed change was held on Thursday, September 9 2010. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In addition, the Office of New Schools proposes to amend the existing charter school agreement for the charter school to incorporate revisions to the Charter School Agreement and Accountability Plan. CHARTER EVALUATION: After receiving the charter renewal proposal, the Office of New Schools conducted a comprehensive evaluation of Noble Street's performance and operations. This evaluation included a review of the proposal, facilities surveys, financial analysis, and academic site visits of the seven campuses in which teaching and learning, leadership and governance, learning communities and services provided to English Language Learners and students with special needs were assessed. A public hearing was conducted on December 4, 2008 to receive public comment on the application to renew the Charter School Agreement with Noble Network of Charter Schools for an additional five years. There was no public testimony, oral or written, from anyone in opposition of the renewal of Noble Network of Charter Schools. Since 2004-2005, the charter school's attendance rate has exceeded 94%. In 2007-2008, zero percent of students at the Noble Street campuses dropped out of school. While Noble Street experienced a slight decline in the percent of students meeting/exceeding state standards on the PS&E Composite, Noble Street's average ACT Composite score has stayed above an 18. In 2007-2008, Noble Street's graduation rate (88.2%) ranked in the top 20 percent of district high schools. From 2004-2005 to 2007-2008, Noble Street received 37 out of 49 high ratings and 10 out of 49 middle ratings on their absolute student indicators found in the framework put forth by the district for assessing charter school pupil performance. The percentage of high ratings has increased over time. Looking across all of the school performance indicators, Noble Street Charter School can be categorized as "Making Reasonable Progress" toward achieving pupil performance standards using the framework put forth by the district for assessing charter school pupil performance.

RENEWAL TERM: The term of the Noble Network of Charter Schools' charter agreement is being extended for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2014. The renewal agreement will incorporate specific conditions to be fulfilled by the charter holder and the specific timeframes in which they must be fulfilled.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include relevant terms and conditions, including any indemnities to be provided to the charter school, in the written amended and restated Charter School Agreement which shall reflect resolution of any and all outstanding issues between the Board and the governing body of the charter school including, but not limited to: site location, enrollment, funding, educational program, financial controls and practices, academic accountability and evaluations. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the amended and restated Charter School Agreement. Authorize the Executive Officer of the Office of New Schools to issue a letter notifying the Illinois State Board of Education of the action (s) approved hereunder and to submit the approved proposal and signed amended and restated Charter School Agreement to the Illinois State Board of Education for certification.

This January 2008 amendment is necessary to authorize the Chicago Charter School Foundation to change the address of the CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus from 1547 W. 95th Street to the permanent address of 8001 S. Honore. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The amended agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original Charter School Agreement (authorized by Board Report 97-0122-EX4 as amended by Board Report 00-0223-EX3) is for a term commencing July 1, 1997 and ending June 30, 2007 and authorized CCSF to operate four campuses with a total enrollment of 5,000. The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2007 (authorized by Board Report 01-1219-EX2), and subsequently amended as follows:

- Board Report 04-0428-EX4: Approved the addition of a Pre-K program.
- Board Report 05-0126-EX6: Approved an increase in the enrollment cap to 5426 students and the establishment of an elementary school campus at 7850 S. Chappel Avenue
- Board Report 05-0727-EX13: Approved the establishment of a new campus at 8130 S California, an increase of the enrollment cap to 6211 students and a change of address for the Avalon/South Shore campus from 7850 S. Chappel Avenue to 1501 E. 83rd Place
- Board Report 05-1116-EX12: Approved the establishment of a new campus at 8101 S Honore, an increase of the enrollment cap to 7111 students, pre-approved the establishment of an additional campus to be located on the South Side of Chicago and an increase of the enrollment cap to 8011 students.
- Board Report 06-0628-EX10: Approved a correction of the address for the Ralph Ellison campus from of 8101 S. Honore to 8001 S. Honore and authorized the operation of the campus in a different facility for the 2006 – 2007 school year.
- Board Report 06-0927-EX7: Approved the reduction of the enrollment cap for CCSF to 7111 because the authorization for the pre-approved campus on the South Side of Chicago was rescinded.
- Board Report 06-1115-EX6: Approved the establishment a new campus at 3834 N. Spaulding to open in the Fall of 2007 and an increase of the enrollment cap to 7,647 students, which approval was contingent upon renewal of the charter and Charter School Agreement.

The 2002 Charter School Agreement, as amended, authorizes CCSF to operate a total of 10 campuses under the name of "Chicago International Charter School" with a maximum enrollment of 7,111. The agreement incorporates an accountability plan whereby the school is evaluated by the Board each year based on numerous factors related to its academic, financial and operational performance.

CHARTER RENEWAL PROPOSAL: CCSF submitted a renewal proposal on December 1, 2006, to continue the operation of the Chicago International Charter School under a unified mission, using AQS, Edison, Civitas and Victory to provide comprehensive school management. CCSF has since modified its renewal proposal to include commitments to operate eleven (11) campuses as one unified school through the use of uniform assessment plans and performance standards, curriculum and school calendar alignment, as well as standard governance, operational, employment, educational and admissions policies. The Charter School shall serve grades Pre-Kindergarten through 12 with a maximum student enrollment of 7,647.

In August 2007, CCSF submitted a material modification to (a) change the address of the CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus and (b) change the name of the CICS – Avondale Campus located at 3820 N Spaulding to CICS – Irving Park Campus. The CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus will now be located at 1547 W 95th Street, Chicago, IL 60643. The CICS – Avondale Campus will now be known as the CICS – Irving Park Campus.

On July 9, 2007, CCSF submitted a Renaissance proposal as a response to an invited Request for Proposals to currently operating school providers. CCSF requests to establish the Chicago International Charter School – Friesse Campus to be located at 9535 S. Throop and to increase the at capacity enrollment by 520 to 8,167. The school is scheduled to open in the fall of 2008 at full capacity and will serve 520 students in grades K-3. A public hearing was held on October 11, 2007.

In December 2007, CCSF submitted a material modification to change the address of the CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus. The CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus will now be located at 8001 S. Honore Street, Chicago, IL 60620.

In March 2008, CCSF submitted a material modification to correct the following information (a) the contact information for the Chicago Charter School Foundation (b) the addresses of the CICS – Friesse Campus, CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus, and CICS – Washington Park Campus (c) the year the CICS – Longwood Campus and CICS – Washington Park Campus opened, (d) correct the capacity enrollments for 7 campuses.

In addition, CCSF submitted a material modification to change the following (a) the grade structure for the CICS – Longwood Campus and the CICS – Friesse Campus, (b) increase the at capacity enrollment for the CICS – Friesse Campus, (c) decrease the at capacity enrollment for the CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus, and (d) change the overall at capacity enrollment for the CICS Charter School.

The correct address for the CICS – Friesse Campus is 9535 S. Loomis, Chicago, IL 60643. The correct address for the CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus is 1817 W. 80th Street, Chicago, IL 60620. The correct address for the CICS – Washington Park Campus is 6105 S. Michigan. The CICS – Longwood Campus opened in 1997 and CICS – Washington Park Campus opened in 2001. The at capacity enrollments for 7 CICS Campuses are correctly listed below.

The CICS – Longwood Campus will now serve grades 3 through 12. The CICS – Friesse Campus will now serve grades K through 2. The at capacity enrollment for the CICS – Friesse Campus will increase from 520 to 590. The at capacity enrollment for the CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus will decrease from 900 to 600.

The overall at capacity enrollment for all 12 CICS Campuses will now be 8000.

On June 28, 2008, the Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a design statement to open a new elementary school as a part of their pre-qualified status (authorized by Board Report 07-1114-EX4). CCSF proposes to establish the Chicago International Charter School – Altgeld Gardens Campus to be located at 13300 S. Langley and to increase their overall at capacity enrollment by 350 students to 8350. The school is scheduled to open in the fall of 2009 at full capacity and will serve 350 students in grades K – 8. Public hearings were held on September 3, 2008, October 6, 2008 and October 15, 2008. The October 15th hearing was recorded and a summary report of each hearing is available for review.

The Chicago Charter School Foundation is authorized to operate a pre-kindergarten program in the same building as the charter school. The children enrolled in the pre-kindergarten will not be included in the enrollment of the charter school and the pre-kindergarten program will not be governed by the Charter School Agreement. To the extent the Board provides funding for the pre-kindergarten program, that program will be subject to a separate agreement with and separate funding authorized by the Office of Early Childhood Education. A material breach of any contract between the Board and CCSF for operation of a pre-kindergarten program or the charter school may be treated as a breach of the other contract.

In October 2008 the Chicago Charter School Foundation also submitted a material modification to change the name of the Chicago International Charter School – Friesse Campus. The name will now be known as the Chicago International Charter School – Loomis Primary Campus.

In August 2009 the Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a material modification to change the name of the Chicago International Charter School – Altgeld Gardens Campus to the Chicago International Charter School – Lloyd Bond Campus. A public hearing for the proposed name change was held on Tuesday, August 11, 2009. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

On August 10, 2009, the Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a proposal to open a new middle/high school at 801 East 133rd Place. CCSF proposes to establish the Chicago International Charter School – Carver Campus in the fall of 2010, serving 500 students in grades 6-12 and to increase the overall at capacity enrollment at the charter school by 900 to 9,250 students. At capacity, the Carver Campus will serve up to 900 students in grades 6-12. Public hearings, as required by statute, were held on June 23, 2009, September 10, 2009 and November 9, 2009. The public hearings were recorded and summary reports for all hearings are available for review.

In March 2010 the Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a material modification to (a) change the name of the CICS – Carver Campus to the CICS – Larry Hawkins Campus, (b) change the grade structure at the CICS – Larry Hawkins Campus from 6 through 12 to 7 through 12, and (c) change the grade structure at the CICS – Lloyd Bond Campus from K through 8 to K through 6. A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Tuesday March 16, 2010. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review

In September 2010 the Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a material modification to (a) decrease the at capacity enrollment at the CICS – Ralph Ellison Campus by 30 students to a new at capacity enrollment of 570 students and (b) increase the at capacity enrollment at the CICS – Bucktown Campus by 30 students to a new at capacity enrollment of 670 students. The total at capacity enrollment for the charter school will remain the same. A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Thursday, October 14, 2010. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In August 2010, the Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a proposal to (a) add a new middle/high school campus, the ChicagoQuest North Campus, to open at a location to be determined in the fall of 2011, and (b) add two new middle/high school campuses, the ChicagoQuest West and ChicagoQuest South Campuses, to open at a location to be determined in the fall of 2012. The ChicagoQuest North Campus will open serving 504 students in grades 6 through 7. The campus will grow to serve an at capacity enrollment of 801 students in grades 6 through 12. The ChicagoQuest West and ChicagoQuest South Campuses will each open serving 247 students in grades 6-8. Each campus will grow to serve an at capacity enrollment of 801 students in grades 6 through 12. The entire at capacity enrollment of the charter school will increase by 801 students to a new at capacity enrollment of 10,051 in the fall of 2011. The overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school will increase by 1602 to 11,653 in the fall of 2012.

CONTINGENT APPROVAL: Approval to open the 2011 and 2012 campuses and the execution of an amendment to the Charter School Agreement are contingent upon a final review and approval of the new campus proposals, an assessment of the District's need for this charter school campuses based upon demographics and student demands, any required subsequent public hearings, and Board approval of the proposed school site. These benchmarks will be communicated to the school operator in a formal Letter of Conditions with all deadlines to be met by March 15, 2011 for the 2011 campus and March 15, 2012 for the 2012 campuses. The Office of New Schools will oversee the enforcement of these deadlines, failure to meet these deadlines may, at the option of the Board, result in the rescission of the authority granted herein and the denial of the approval to open this new campus. A final review of this new campus proposal will be conducted by the Chief Executive Officer on or before April 15, 2011 or April 15, 2012 to determine final approval or denial of the new campus proposal and satisfactory resolution of all material issues related to the opening of the new middle/high campuses. The obligation to secure and prepare an independent facility for campuses opening in the fall of 2011 and 2012 is the responsibility of the charter school. The Board is not undertaking any responsibility for securing a facility in the event the charter school is unable to do so.

CHARTER EVALUATION: After receiving the charter renewal proposal, the Office of New Schools conducted a comprehensive evaluation of the CCSF's performance and operations. This evaluation included a review of the proposal, facilities surveys, financial analysis, and academic site visits of multiple CCSF campuses in which teaching and learning, leadership and governance, and the learning community were assessed. In addition to the foregoing, the Office of New Schools evaluated the school's student performance. From 2002 to 2006, CCSF received 13 out of 22 high ratings and 5 out of 22 middle ratings on their absolute student performance indicators. On the 2006 ISAT, 67.40% of CCSF students met or exceeded state standards. Finally, the school experienced a high attendance rate of 94.4% in 2005-2006.

A Comprehensive Evaluation Team ("CET") was convened to review the evidence and make a recommendation regarding the renewal of the school. Based on the school's performance on these and other accountability criteria, the CET recommends that Chicago International Charter School be authorized to continue operating as a charter school.

RENEWAL TERM: The term of CCSF's charter and charter school agreement is being extended for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2007 and ending June 30, 2012.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include relevant terms and conditions, including any indemnities to be provided to the charter school, in the written Charter School Agreement and amendment, which shall reflect resolution of any and all outstanding issues between the Board and the governing body of the charter school including, but not limited to: site location, enrollment, funding, educational program, financial controls and practices, academic accountability and evaluations. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the Charter School Agreement and amendment. Authorize the Executive Director of the Office of New Schools to issue a letter notifying the Illinois State Board of Education of the action (s) approved hereunder and to submit the approved proposal and signed Charter School Agreement to the Illinois State Board of Education for certification.

LSC REVIEW: Approval of Local School Councils is not applicable to this report.

FINANCIAL: The financial implications will be addressed during the development of the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 fiscal year budgets. Since the School Code of Illinois prohibits the incurring of any liability unless an appropriation has been previously made, expenditures beyond FY10 are deemed to be contingent liabilities only, subject to appropriation in subsequent fiscal year budgets. The cost of this additional enrollment will be approximately \$3,823,500.00 in 2010-2011. Chicago Charter School Foundation will also receive supplemental funding amounts of \$239,410.00 in FY11, \$168,125.00 in FY12, and \$100,875.00 in FY13. If Chicago Charter School Foundation applies to the Renaissance Schools Fund for funding for the new campus and is not approved for funding, the Board shall provide a one-time payment to the new campus for planning positions in an amount not to exceed \$170,000.00.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Inspector General - Each Party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the Provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3, which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board members during the one-year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's indebtedness Policy adopted June 26, 1996 (96-0626-PO3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted June 23, 2004 (04-0623-PO4), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

DESCRIPTION: The Charter Schools Law (105 ILCS 5/27A-1 et seq., as amended) provides that up to 70 charter schools may be operated in the city of Chicago. Proposals to operate charter schools are submitted to the Board for evaluation pursuant to the standards set forth in 105 ILCS 5/27A-8, and the Board convenes a public meeting to obtain information to assist in its decision to grant or deny each proposal and report its action to the Illinois State Board of Education. The State Board determines whether the approved charter school proposal and the proposed contract satisfy the provisions of the Charter Schools Law and, if so, certifies the charter school.

The agreement incorporates an accountability plan where the school is evaluated by the Board each year based on numerous factors related to its academic, financial and operational performance.

CHARTER APPLICATION PROPOSAL: The Christopher House Charter School (Christopher House) proposal was submitted by Christopher House, Inc. and received by the Board in August 2010. Christopher House Charter School will provide a continuum of high-quality educational services that responds to children's development stages with increasing academic rigor; intensive parent education, social/emotional support for student and family support; an extended school-day and school year as well as after school academic enrichment services; arts integration that celebrates cultural traditions and promotes academic achievement; commitment to daily physical fitness and wellness education to promote discipline and healthy lifestyles; and comprehensive, measurable assessment of students' educational, social and emotional development starting as early as infancy. Christopher House will provide the educational and support services to meet and exceed high expectations and prepare students with the skills, knowledge and experiences to ensure school and lifetime success. The school is stated to open in the fall of 2012 at a site to be determined serving 120 students in grades K-1. At capacity, the school will serve 540 students in grades K-8. A public hearing on charter school submissions submitted in 2010, as required by statute, was held on December 13, 2010.

CONTINGENT APPROVAL: Approval to open the charter school and the execution of a Charter School Agreement are contingent upon a final review and approval of the charter school proposal, an assessment of the District's need for this charter school based upon demographics and student demands, any required subsequent public hearings, Board approval of the proposed school site, and Board approval of an addendum to the existing lease agreement (authorized by Board Report 09-0722-OP2) to operate a charter school at the facility for a term not to exceed five years. A final review of this charter school proposal will be conducted by the Chief Executive Officer on or before April 15, 2012 to determine final approval or denial of the new charter school proposal and satisfactory resolution of all material issues related to the opening of the new charter school. The obligation to secure and prepare an independent facility for the charter school is the responsibility of the charter school. The Board is not undertaking any responsibility for securing a facility in the event the charter school is unable to do so.

TERM: The term of the Christopher House charter and agreement shall commence July 1, 2012 and end June 30, 2017.

DESCRIPTION: The Chief Executive Officer is requesting approval of the SIPAAAs for correcting academic deficiencies for the 434 schools noted on the attached Exhibit A as required by ISBE. These schools are on probation and/or are in school improvement status for the 2010-2011 school year. This includes the 28 schools with Corrective Action status under NCLB that have developed corrective action plans. Exhibit A excludes schools that closed at the end of the 2009-2010 school year and schools for which a two-year SIPAAA was approved through Board Report 10-0125-EX5.

The SIPAAAs were developed pursuant to Sections 5/2-3.25d and 5/34-2.4 of the Illinois School Code. Board approval of school improvement plans is required for schools placed on probation pursuant to Section 5/34-8.3 and schools designated by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) as being in school improvement status pursuant to Section 5/2-3.25d. These plans include specific steps that the Local School Councils and school staff must take to correct deficiencies and specific objective criteria by which the schools' subsequent progress shall be judged. For schools in Corrective Action, corrective action plans were developed pursuant to Section 1116(b)(5)(7) of the No Child Left Behind Act and included in the SIPAAA.

Individual SIPAAAs were developed collaboratively at each school with the assistance of the Chief Area Offices, AMPS Office or the Office of New Schools, the Office of Management and Budget, Local School Councils, parent and community representatives, and school personnel. Each school's SIPAAA includes specific expenditures directly calculated to correct educational and operational deficiencies that resulted in the school being placed on probation or in school improvement status. Schools appended to the SIPAAA, as applicable, a Parent Compact and Parent Involvement Policy, technology plan, attendance plan and for high schools, Advanced Placement (AP) plan. Many plans included the following actions: implementing new reading and mathematics programs, providing professional development, implementing reduced class size, purchasing instructional materials, and teaching reading at the high school level.

Once submitted to the Area Offices, AMPS Office or Office of New Schools, SIPAAAs were reviewed to ensure that: areas in need of improvement were addressed, the stated targets and activities were consistent with trend analyses and analysis of current conditions, instruction was the focus, and plans were supported by schools' discretionary school improvement (state and federal) funds.

For schools in Corrective Action, the school's principal together with Chief Area Officer, AMPS Officer or Officer of New Schools selected one or more corrective actions from those enumerated under No Child Left Behind. They further ensured that the school's SIPAAA included the relevant details of those corrective actions plans and that funding was appropriated to those activities as necessary.

Monitoring of and support for these SIPAAAs and corrective action plans will be the responsibility of the Chief Area Offices, AMPS Office or the Office of New Schools with the assistance of the Office of Management and Budget, the Chief Performance Office, and the Office of Grants Management and Administration. The Chief Area Officer is authorized to modify a probation school's SIPAAA as necessary to correct deficiencies throughout the school year.

Copies of the fully executed SIPAAAs and corrective action plans are available in the Chief Area Offices, AMPS Office or the Office of New Schools.

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

The Public Building Commission ("PBC") holds title to the Edgebrook School property for the Board of Education. The Chicago Park District ("CPD") owns property adjacent to Edgebrook School. CPD also licenses property from the Board for ~~athletic facilities~~ a baseball field adjacent to Edgebrook School. The Board needs 15,337 square feet of CPD land described on Exhibit A for the construction of an addition to Edgebrook School ("Edgebrook Addition"). CPD has agreed to convey the 15,337 square feet of land described on Exhibit A to the Board for the Edgebrook Addition in exchange for the 15,337 square feet of Board property described on Exhibit B and a twenty (20) year non-revocable Reciprocal License Shared Use Agreement that will allow CPD and the Board to use and maintain ~~athletic facilities~~ the baseball field adjacent to Edgebrook School on property owned by CPD and the Board as shown on Exhibit GD.

The purpose of this Board Report is to authorize: (1.) The Board shall repair, or cause to be repaired by the PBC, any damage it causes to the Temporary License Area, including equipment, and return the Temporary License Area to CPD in the same condition as it was received.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the President and the Secretary to execute the Lease Amendment and any and all conveyance documents required to effectuate the conveyance of the property described on Exhibit B to CPD and to accept the Property described on Exhibit A from CPD. 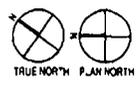
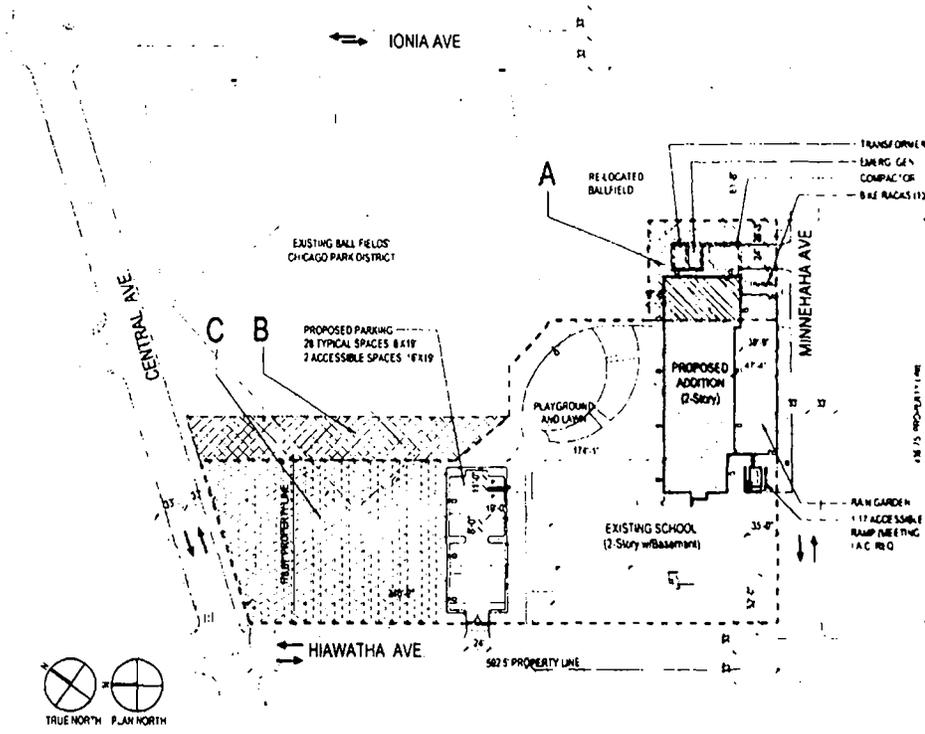

BASIC TERMS OF IGA:

The IGA provides for the design and construction of Marshall Park in proximity to Marshall Metro High School (as described on Exhibit A and depicted on Exhibit B, both attached hereto) by the PBC.
